





Honeycutt

Authorities from at least three area agencies have charged a Knoxville man with multiple counts of theft and burglary after he allegedly broke into several homes and stole thousands of dollars worth of jewelry, electronics and other items. Knox County detectives reported finding some of the items at the man's residence, which local victims were able to identify as being taken from their homes.

Ryan Wayne Honeycutt, 32, of Fordham Way, Knoxville, was charged with three counts

of theft over \$1000 and three counts of aggravated burglary.

According to warrants, filed by Detective Jason, Smith, LCSO CID; on March 10, 2009, deputies from the Loudon County Sheriff's Office responded to Point Harbor Drive in Lenoir City in reference to a suspicious person. Upon arrival by the homeowners, they discovered a large amount of jewelry had been taken along with a Sony Bravia Flat Screen TV. Over \$1000 in property was taken from the residence of the victims.

On May 4, 2009 Knox County Detective discovered Ryan Wayne Honeycutt to be in possession of jewelry at his residence that was later identified by the victims as theirs.

Items pawned by Mr. Honeycutt, using an assumed identity, were also retrieved by Knox County Detectives and several items identified by the victims belonged to her.

Upon interviewing Mr. Honeycutt, he admitted to committing several burglaries in Loudon County.

In another warrant, filed by Detective Jack Fine, LCPD; On the 29th of April, 2009, sometime between the hours of 7:30am and 6pm Honeycutt forced his way into a home on Highland Circle in Lenoir City, by forcing open the back door entrance to the lower level of the house, breaking the door facing, causing ap-

proximately \$300 in damage and did take from the victims home a jewelry box containing over \$7800 worth of assorted jewelry and did remove from the victims bathroom a bottle of pain medication worth approximately \$65, then left the premises.

In another warrant, filed by Detective Jason Smith, LCSO CID; on April 9, 2009 the victim reported her residence on Anglewood Drive had been burglarized. Entry was made by forcing open a rear door. Items taken included a Toshiba laptop, flat screen TV, and a large amount of jewelry.

On May 4, 2009 Knox County found Honeycutt to be in possession of the laptop and many pieces of jewelry.

In an interview Honeycutt did admit to committing several burglaries in Loudon County.



Mr. Allison gave agents verbal and written consent to search his residence for a marijuana grow that Allison stated was present.

During the search agents found two separate sophisticated hydroponics grow operations within the residence containing a total of 32 marijuana plants in various stages of growth.

The search also revealed a plastic container with marijuana, scales, baggies, marijuana grinders, marijuana growing ledgers, and a variety of prescription medication.

The grow operation was dismantled and James Allison was charged with manufacturing marijuana 20-99 plants, possession of schedule VI (marijuana), possession of drug paraphernalia and possession of a schedule III controlled substance.

No License





More than eighty prescription pills reportedly were found on a man after he was taken into custody for DUI after police responded to an unwanted guest call in Philadelphia where the man had left prior to their arrival.

Larry Junior Lee, 'aka' Larry Matt Lee, Lovell Road, day, around 1:41 AM,

Knox ville was charged with DUI 1st offense, driving on revoked possession license, of schedule II endocet, and possession of schedule II oxycodone.

on an unwanted guest call. While enroute, the deputy was advised it had turned into a physical domestic between husband and wife. Dispatch then advised the husband left the residence in a black Ford Explorer traveling towards Philadelphia on Steekee Road and he was intoxicated.

made contact with the Explorer turning onto Macedonia Road. It crossed the center line twice and the deputy attempted to stop it in the parking lot of New Macedonia Church. It finally stopped on Seed Tick Road in front of a residence. The driver was identified by his Tennessee ID Card as Larry Junior Lee.

Lee had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his person, red watery eyes, and slurred speech. Mr. Lee also had two pill bottles in his lap when he was stopped. He was asked to do field sobriety tasks and he agreed but performed poorly on them.

A check of Mr. Lee's drivers license through NCIC revealed he was

revoked and at that time he was taken into custody.

One of the pill bottles Mr. Lee had in his possession contained 44 white round pills with Watson 932 imprinted on them believed to be 10 mg. oxycodone. The other bottle had 13 yellow oval pills with E797 imprinted on them believed to be 10 mg. endocet and 30 white round pills with Watson 932 imprinted on them believed to be 10 mg. oxycodone.

Neither pill bottle had a prescription for any of the pills contained in them. Mr. Lee was transported to the Loudon County Jail where he was given a breath test. His results were .12%. Lt. Adam Yokley, LCSO was also on the scene.




