


Fake urine sample, threats made to officers result in arrests of 2



On December 9th, 2010, Mr. Oneal reported to LCSO's sex offender registrar that he was going to be evicted from his residence on Muddy Creek Road in Lenoir City. The registrar advised Oneal he had forty eight hours to report once he moved.

On February 23rd, 2011, Mr. Oneal was approached by Detective Jonathan Sartin, LCPD and asked where he was living at. Oneal advised he was living


Mr. Swindell was read the implied consent advisement and agreed. His blood alcohol was .07%. Swindell's passengers were all charged with public intoxication.


Kaitlin Marie Costello, 23, 38th Avenue, Nashville advised she'd drank 4 beers.

Rosalio Gonzalez Granados, 23, Hall Street, Lenoir City was charged with disorderly conduct, resisting arrest/stop/ halt/frisk and evading arrest.

According to an affidavit filed by Probation Officer Chris Goddard; on the afternoon of February 22nd, 2011, at the ETHRA Misdemeanor Probation Office on Blair Bend Road in Loudon, Mr. Goddard lawfully administered an instant urine drug

screen to Mr. Gonzalez as ordered by Mr. Gonzalez's probation officer Kelly Schaffer.

While Mr. Gonzalez was in the process of producing a specimen for screening, Officer Goddard witnessed him in possession of urine from a third party or synthetic urine, which Mr. Gonzalez had stored in a condom attached to the drawstring of his sweat pants. Mr. Gonzalez attempted to use the urine which, was concealed, instead of his own urine for the purpose of falsi-

fying a drug screen.

On February 23rd, 2011, Deputy Daniel Ferguson, LCSO was advised by the jail control room there was a subject at the clerk's office that had active warrants. Deputy Ferguson went to the clerk's office to affect the arrest. The person was identified as Marco Gonzalez. Deputy Ferguson arrested him at that time.

The man with him, said he was Gonzalez's brother-in-law, Rosalio Gonzalez Granados. He stated he checked

with Marco's probation officer Kelly Schaffer and Marco did not have to go to jail.

Deputies Petty and Watkins arrived and tried to explain to Mr. Granados the process he would have to go through and he proceeded to call them liars and started cursing at them, telling Deputy Watkins, "If you didn't have that badge on, I would whoop your a\$\$."





The value of the loss was estimated at \$750. The theft is under investigation.


