

2 charged in aggravated robbery of woman

Derrik Allen Bradshaw, 19, Calloway Road, Loudon was charged with aggravated assault and unlawful possession of a weapon.

The report states, Sunday, at approximately 8:23 PM, Deputy Rondel M. Branam, LCSO re-





Busted

9th DTF Agents arrested multiple persons Wednesday after conducting surveillance at a Loudon pharmacy and finding several persons in possession of meth making ingredients, drugs and other paraphernalia. One man reportedly was caught shooting up when agents approached the suspect's vehicles, and another man in possession of meth making products, drugs and other paraphernalia was arrested just down the highway when the vehicle he was a passenger in was stopped for a seat belt violation.

Chastity Janell Bowers, 20, Campground Road, Madisonville was charged Wednesday with promotion of methamphetamine manufacture, possession of schedule IV controlled substance alprazolam, possession of schedule II am-

phetamine, and simple possession of marijuana.

Jeffrey Larry Millsaps, 24, George Thomas Road, Vonore was charged with possession of schedule II controlled substance, promotion of methamphetamine manufacture, and possession of drug paraphernalia.

Michael Scott Stewart, 32, Easter Drive, Madisonville was charged with possession of schedule II controlled substance, promotion of methamphetamine manufacture, and criminal simulation.

Lovonda Nicolette Cooper, 21, Brakebill Road, Vonore was charged with possession of legend drugs, promoting the manufacturing of methamphetamine, and possession of drug paraphernalia.

David Reed Colvin, 40, also of Brakebill Road, Vonore was charged with promotion of methamphetamine manufacture.

According to records, agents of the 9th Drug Task Force were conducting surveillance at the Rite Aide in Loudon Wednesday when two vehicles began to look suspicious. After observing numerous individuals enter and exit the pharmacy and pass small bags back and forth, the agents approached the vehicles, a 1993 Nissan Quest and a 2004 Buick LaSabre.

Agents Richard Wood and Jeff Vittatoe witnessed a back seat passenger of the van, Jeffrey Millsaps, attempting to inject a substance into his arm with a syringe, while a front seat passenger began furtive gestures in the floor area.

All occupants were removed from the vehicles and numerous items were seen in plain view in the van, including two syringes, a pipe, propane torch and several boxes of psuedophedrine.

Chastity Bowers was in the front passenger seat. Ms. Bowers had multiple small plastic bags containing a white powder like substance that tested positive for the presence of methamphetamine. Also in her possession was one hypodermic needle, two alprazolam, one amphetamine pill and a metal container containing a green leafy substance believed

to be marijuana.

Ms. Bowers had purchased psuedophedrine based products in the past, with the intention of using them or had used them to make methamphetamine.

Jeffrey Millsaps was in possession of one blue pill tentatively identified as oxycodone. Millsaps was seen by Agent Brendan DeBoer buying psuedoephedrine from the Rite Aide. It was determined he purchased the box with the understanding it was being used to make methamphetamine.

Michael Scott Stewart was the driver of the van and was found to be in possession of two pinkish colored capsules he advised were morphine pills. He also said he didn't have a prescription for the pills.

Stewart admitted he bought a 20 oz. bottle of orange drink and a can of Drano. Those items are often used in conjunction with the psuedoephedrine to manufacture meth. In addition, it was discovered he purchased more psuedoephedrine than Tennessee law allows, during the last 90 days. Mr. Stewart had a false identification with his picture and the name Michael Scott Ford.



Lovonda Cooper was in the back seat of the van. She had numerous prescription pills, all tentatively identified as non schedule legend drugs, and a cut piece of straw with a white residue on the inside. Ms. Cooper was observed by Agent DeBoer purchasing a psuedoephedrine based product at the Rite Aide with the understanding it was being used to make meth.

David Colvin was likewise

seen by agents buying a psue-doephedrine based product. He left the store and met with the occupants in the van and turned it over to them. Colvin arrived in a separate vehicle and it was determined he was purchasing the box of medicine with the knowledge it would to be used to make methamphetamine.

Just down the highway, another man was taken into custody on meth charges.

Edgar Allen Arbogast, 25, Lees Chapel Road, Sweetwater was charged with promotion of methamphetamine manufacture, unlawful possession of schedule III controlled substance and possession of drug paraphernalia.

According to reports, Mr. Arbogast was a passenger in a vehicle stopped in Loudon on Highway 72 and Steekee Road Wednesday for violation of the seat belt law.

During a consensual search of the vehicle, Mr. Arbogast was found to be in possession of a small blue lunch cooler containing a box of 240 mg. Lorata-D Sinus tablets, two bent spoons, rolling papers, six syringes, a pill crusher, a plastic bottle containing part of a suspected methadone wafer and a small plastic bottle with cotton soaked with an orange colored substance believed to be methadone.

Mr. Arbogast was advised of his rights before telling the agents all the items were his, and the box of sinus tablets were going to be used to manufacture methamphetamine.

Agent Jeff Vittatoe, 9th DTF made the arrest.

Shortly after leaving the residence, dispatch advised Deputy Branam,


