

Melody Lee Ann Wiggins, 31, Steekee School Road, Loudon was charged with DUI, driving on a revoked license and indirect criminal contempt.

Tobias 'Toby' Tuck, 33, Riverview Road, Loudon was charged with public intoxication.

According to reports, Thursday, around 11:28 PM, Deputy Robbie Lane, LCSO was dispatched to Steekee Creek Road for an accident without injury. When he arrived on scene he found a red Toyota in someone's yard and made contact with Melody Wiggins and Tobias Tuck.

The pair had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage about themselves, red watery eyes, slurred speech and were unsteady on their feet.

Wiggins and Tuck both denied being the driver of the car, but after speaking to them Wiggins admitted she was the driver.

Ms. Wiggins was asked to perform field sobriety tasks

and performed poorly on them. A check of her name and date of birth for her license status came back revoked. Ms. Wiggins was read the implied consent advisement and agreed to give a blood sample. She was transported to Fort Loudoun ER for a blood draw and also was seen for rib pain.

Mr. Tuck was deemed a threat to the safety of himself and the public due to his intoxication and was also placed under arrest. Deputy Charles Butler, LCSO was also at the scene.

Wiggins was charged with indirect criminal contempt the next morning, Friday, around 11:20 AM. after she was warned several times to stop trying to communicate with Tobias Tuck while in Arraignment Court. She was also agitated because Magistrate Kim Nix would not issue her a OR (own recognizance) bond.

After several commands were given to Ms. Wiggins, Deputy Olwin Norman, LCSO called Deputy Lonnie Gaut to Arraignment Court to remove Ms. Wiggins from the courtroom and when he arrived, Ms. Wiggins threw her pen across the table and wadded her affidavit of indigent form up and threw it across the desk as well.

Wiggins also used profanity when she was leaving and there was a child under the age of 10 in the courtroom at the time.



When Rhoades was placed under arrest he became verbally abusive and refused to answer any information for booking procedures.







that he may be running cons and was a convicted felon. Upon further investigation the Lt. learned Mr. Montana has a criminal history that includes felony unlawful sexual penetration in Minnesota.

Records indicate the lawman also learned Montana has sold weapons in the area and a man who lives on Monterey Drive in Loudon purchased a Smith & Wesson model 686 from Mr. Montana at his residence in November of 2010. The weapon was taken into evidence.

Upon making contact with him at his fiance's residence in Loudon County, Montana tried to flee by kicking open a padlocked door. When he was apprehended, Montana admitted records attached with a photo included with the conviction of the sexual penetration charge was his and he had been found guilty on the charge.

Upton ran Mr. Montana's finger prints and they came back as belonging to a man identified as Frank Cruze. Lt. Upton has contacted Federal Authorities concerning Mr. Cruze.

Resident licenses may be purchased by: persons who possess a valid Tennessee driver's license; persons who have lived in Tennessee for 90 consecutive days with the genuine intent of making Tennessee their permanent home; military personnel on active duty in this state and their immediate families, who reside with them, regardless of resident status; students who are enrolled in a Tennessee school, college, or university for at least six months. A Social Security number is required to purchase a Tennessee hunting or fishing license.

The licenses are available at any TWRA regional office or license agent across the state. Licenses may also be purchased online at TWRA's website: www.tnwildlife.org and charged to a credit card. Licenses may also be ordered by telephone and charged to a credit card by calling 1-888-814-8972. All licenses purchased by credit card will be charged a processing and handling fee. Effective as of March 1, the new fees over the telephone are \$7.50 for those licenses mailed and \$6.25 for those not mailed. Through the internet, charges are \$4.25 for those licenses mailed and \$3 for self-prints.

To expedite telephone orders, the caller should have ready the name, address, physical description, Social Security number, driver's license number, TWRA ID number (if renewal), and credit card number.

Licenses are printed on a special tear-resistant, waterproof paper. In case of a lost license, duplicate licenses can be obtained from any REAL license agent for a \$7 fee.

Permits

of Forestry wants to remind citizens that if they are considering doing outdoor burning, a burn permit is required.

The free burn permits are required in all areas of the state by law until May 15 unless otherwise covered by local ordinances. Residents should check with their city government for any local restrictions. The permits can be obtained by calling your local Division of Forestry office between the hours of 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Monday thru Friday.Permits are generally good for 24 hours and can be issued for weekend burning. Phone numbers for each office can be found in the state government section of your local phone book, or by visiting www.BurnSafeTN.org and clicking on the 'Burn Permits' button. The website is also a good source of information for safe debris burning practices and fire prevention tips including how to protect your home in the event of a wildfire.

Over 388,000 permits were issued last year for activities that included unconfined, outdoor burning of brush and leaves, untreated wood waste and burning to clear land. The number of requests on any given day can be high, so the Division asks residents to exercise patience if they experience any delay in getting a per-

Once a burn permit is obtained, debris burners should practice common sense while conducting a burn. This includes:

Establish a control line around the fire, down to bare soil before conducting the burn

local fire departments in advance as a courtesy

* Have tools on hand such as a leaf rake and garden hose or bucket of water to help control the fire

* Watch for changing weather conditions as winds can blow the fire in the wrong direction.

* Always stay with your fire until it is completely out. It is not only the smart thing to do, but it is also illegal to leave an open fire unattended.

Escaped debris burns were the leading cause of wildfires in Tennessee last year accounting for 687 such fires that burned over 4,400 acres. The Division's burn permit system has dramatically helped reduce the numbers of escaped burns since the program began in 1995. Burning without a permit is a Class C misdemeanor punishable by up to 30 days in jail and/or a fine not to exceed \$50. Wildfires caused by arson were the second leading cause last year, but accounted for the largest acreage burning over 12,000 acres. Wildland arson is a class C felony punishable by three to 15 years in prison and up to \$10,000 fines. Anyone with information about suspected arson activity should call the state Fire Marshal's Arson Hotline toll-free at 1-800-762-






