Williams also allegedly threatened to kill his mother if he didn't get what he wanted.


Mrs. Williams told the officers her son placed her in fear of serious bodily injury or death because she didn't know what he would do next. She also stated she didn't want him back on the property.



While bald eagles were taken off the Endangered Species Act in 2007 after a successful national recovery effort, they are protected by the Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act and the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, both federal wildlife statutes. Violations of these statutes carry

maximum criminal penalties of up to \$100,000 and/or one year in federal prison.

Tennessee currently hosts about 140 eagle breeding pairs, according to Scott Somershoe, ornithologist with the TWRA.

Bald eagles historically ranged from Mexico to Alaska. It typically takes four or five years for bald eagles to mature but many do not start breeding until they are much older. They may live 15 to 25 years in the wild. Their primary diet is fish, so most bald eagles are found near rivers and lakes.

A number of organizations and individuals have contributed to the reward including: the TWRA, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, The Humane Society of the United States and the Humane Society Wildlife Land Trust, The American Eagle Foundation, and private donors.

The mission of the TWRA is to preserve, conserve, protect, and enhance the fish and wildlife of the state and their habitats for the use, benefit, and enjoyment of the citizens of Tennessee and its visitors. The agency will foster the safe use of the state's waters through a program of law enforcement, education, and access.
