



that Trichomoniasis is an increasing threat to Tennessee cattle, and this is a preventative measure to keep infected bulls out of the state," said Dr. Charles Hatcher, State Veterinarian. "We want to protect our cattle operations from outbreaks of this potentially harmful disease."

Trichomoniasis, often called 'Trich', is a venereal disease of cattle. Trichomoniasis can cause infertility and abortions, and results in extended breeding seasons and lessens the

number of calves produced, which can cost livestock producers valuable income.

All breeding bulls Tennessee entering must now be accompanied with a certificate of veterinary inspection and be thoroughly tested for Trichomoniasis. A strict testing protocol is in effect, and owners should review the requirements before importing bulls into Tennessee. Exceptions can be given for bulls entering the state for exhibitions or rodeos provided that the bulls do not commingle

with other cows.

"This weekend marks the unofficial start to the most active travel season in the United States," said Department of Safety and Homeland Security Commissioner Bill Gibbons. "As the summer months approach, our Highway Patrol will be diligent in promoting safe driving campaigns and keeping Tennessee roads

and its travelers safe."

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration reports that an estimated 32,788 people died in motor vehicle traffic crashes in 2010, a decline of about three percent from 2009 (33,808 fatalities). Tennessee fatalities increased to 1,033 in 2010, or 4.8 percent from 2009 (986 fatalities). As of April 20, 2011, there have been 216 motor vehicle traffic fatalities, compared to 296 at this time last year. "Our troopers are committed to holiday enforcements and safe driving campaigns throughout the year," said THP Colonel Tracy Trott. "While we never want to see any fatalities on Tennessee roadways, we are encouraged by the decline and hope to report a record low number of traffic deaths by the end of the year."

Just four months into the year, preliminary statistics indicate that 17 motorcyclists have died on Tennessee roadways, a decrease of 14 deaths compared to 31 motorcycle fatalities at this same time a year ago. Also, rural traffic fatalities have decreased by 23.7 percent and unrestrained vehicle occupant fatalities have declined by 25.8 percent.

Ten people were killed in eight crashes on Tennessee roads during the 2010 Easter Holiday weekend. Last year, alcohol

was involved in two of the fatal crashes, and 75 percent of vehicle occupants killed were not wearing seat belts.

"We hope people make smart decisions this Easter weekend," Colonel Trott added. "Don't drink and drive, wear your seat belts, and pay attention to the road. Our goal is for everyone to reach their destination safely."

The Tennessee Department of Safety's (www.TN.Gov/safety) mission is to ensure the safety and general welfare of the public. The department encompasses the Tennessee Highway Patrol, Office of Homeland Security and Driver License Services. General areas of responsibility include law enforcement, safety education, motorist services and terrorism pre-



this is such a fun way for children to learn color wheel basics. This formula is for just one color mixture, so all you have to do is use the same formula for each color if you're planning to make multiple colors of eggs.

The basics: Yellow and Blue = Green; Yellow and Red = Orange; and Red and Blue = Purple; *1 tsp. distilled vinegar *20 drops food coloring *1/2 cup boiling water Directions:

Set a wire cooling rack on a large cookie sheet or roasting pan and then mix water, vinegar, and food coloring in a small bowl. Submerge hard boiled eggs in the dye mixture, turning occasionally until desired

color depth is reached, about 2 to 5 minutes; remove eggs with slotted spoon or tongs and place on rack to dry.

Here is a brief list of common foods that can be used for dye.

*Red: lots of red onion peels, raspberries or cranberry juice

*Pink: smaller amounts of cranberry juice and raspberries, beet juice *Orange: carrots, boiled onion skins, paprika *Yellow: Chamomile tea, green tea, orange or lemon peels (boiled) *Green: Spinach leaves

*Blue: purple grape juice, canned blueberries *Purple: violet blossoms, hibiscus tea, red wine,

purple grape juice *Gold: Turmeric
