



Javon Anthony White, 24, East Warren 12 Mile Road, Warren Michigan was charged (see Pair pg. 6)



Regulations

to make the changes

based on recommendations from the Norris Lake Fisheries Advisory Committee (NL-FAC).

The NLFAC, a community-based group of advisors to the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency, made the recommendation to implement an 18-inch minimum length limit on smallmouth bass with a creel limit of five from Oct. 16-May 31. From June 1-Oct. 15, there

will be a 20-inch minimum length limit with a creel limit of one.

The change replaces the 17-22 inch slot limit. The daily creel limit for largemouth/smallmouth in combination remains five per day on Norris Reservoir. The regulations will be reevaluated in 2015.





and his passenger for identification Mr. Mosley presented a valid Michigan drivers license, but the passenger stated he'd left his wallet at his cousin's house and had no form of ID. He said his name was Nathaniel Tavon Myles and his birth date was April 15th, 1988. He had difficulty spelling his name and advised his license were suspended.

Upon running the man's name and date of birth through NCIC to check for warrants as well as obtain a physical description from


