Man fakes burglary to cover Shopping for meth selling rental television chef lands 1 in jail

A Lenoir City man is accused of causing hundreds of dollars in damages to his McGhee Square apartment when he faked a burglary to cover his selling of an expensive television that he had rented, then sold three days later.

Marty Joseph Humphrey, 23, Kelly Lane, Lenoir City was charged with filing a false police report, felony pawning or conveying rental



property and felony vandalism over \$500.

According to affidavits filed by Officer Kevin Condee, LCPD; on Friday, Mr. Humphrey filed a report with Officer Jamie Whitt, LCPD alleging someone broke into his apartment and stole his television. Later that same day, Officer Condee received information the television was rented by Humphrey from Rent-A-Center and Humphrey had sold the TV and faked the burglary.

During Officer Condee's subsequent investigation, it

was discovered the television had been sold by another male to a woman who returned the TV immediately.

Upon questioning, Humphrey admitted he had either given or sold the television to the male on March 24th, 2011, just 3 days after he rented it from Rent-A-Center.

Humphrey also admitted he damaged his own back door in an attempt to fake the burglary and file the false report, thinking he would not have to pay Rent-A-Center for the television.

Officer Condee made the arrest.

Humphrey received the felony pawning or conveying rental property and felony vandalism over\$500 charges the following day on Saturday.

According to those affidavits, which were also filed by Officer Condee; on March 21st, 2011, Marty J. Humphrey entered into a contractual agreement with Rent-A-Center to rent a television with a retail value of \$1,077.62. On March 24th, 2011, Humphrey

conveyed the television to another party for the purpose of selling it to a third party.


The TV was sold to the third party for \$210. Humphrey admitted to Officer Condee that he received \$100 from the proceeds of the sale.


Humphrey did not have consent from Rent-A-Center, the lawful owner of the TV, to sell or otherwise convey the television.

On April 22nd, 2011, Marty J. Humphrey intentionally damaged the sliding glass door on the back side of his apartment at McGhee Square Apartments. Humphrey admitted to Officer Condee he caused the damage to the door in an attempt to stage a fictitious burglary, which he falsely reported to the Lenoir City Police Department.

Damage to the door and frame was extensive and the estimated cost to replace the door is in excess of \$500.

Officer Condee obtained and served the warrants on Humphrey, who was already incarcerated at the jail.

was also charged with criminal trespass because she was served a no trespass order on April 25th, 2004, fol-





member where he was coming from or how many drinks he'd had prior to driving.


Mr. Smith was transported to the University of Tennessee Medical Center by EMS.

During the inventory of the wrecked Jeep, a Camel cigarette pack was discovered lying outside the driver's side door on the ground. Another identical Camel cigarette pack was found inside the vehicle. The cigarette pack contained a rolled one dollar bill, a clear plastic baggy with a white rock

powder in it and a razor blade.

The white rock powder was weighed at 1.7 grams on a digital scale. It was roadside tested by Loudon County Sheriff's Deputy Billy Hall and tested positive for cocaine.

Implied consent was read to Smith at UT Hospital and he refused. A hold was placed on him through the University of Tennessee Medical Center Security and he was transported to jail upon his release from the hospital.
