
Tweaker couple busted with meth Indicted making materials

Deputy Nathan Wilson, LCSO made the arrest Tuesday at the Knox County Jail.





Robert Thomas Alguire, 22, Mealer Road, Lenoir City was charged with promotion of the manufacture of methamphetamine, and felony possession of drug paraphernalia.

According to reports, Friday, around 9:54 PM, Ms. Flint was driving a green Chevy Cavalier on McGhee Boulevard with the passenger side headlight out and was stopped at the Ken-Jo Market. Her Tennessee drivers license were found to have been suspended and she was unable to provide proof of financial responsibility, nor a registration for the vehicle.

It was discovered Brittani Flint and her passenger, Robert Alguire, were in possession of muriatic acid, rubber tubing, drain cleaner, ammonium nitrate, and coffee filters, which were all contained in a black backpack in the Cavalier.

Those items are commonly used to manufacture methamphetamine. The rubber tubing had been inserted into a plastic bottle containing acid and was being used as a gas generator to manufacture methamphetamine.

During a consensual search of the vehicle, three syringes also were discovered in the shifter console. LCPD Officers Allen Bean and Keith Sennett made the arrests. Investigator Shane Ezell, LCSO-ND was also on the scene.

Dustin Edward McCollister, 24, Robinson Drive, Loudon was charged with DUI 1st/drugs and possession of drug paraphernalia.

According to records, Thursday, around 1:42 AM, Deputy Billy Hall, LCSO observed a white male who was unsteady on his feet in front of Bimbos on Highway 321. The man got into a white Nissan and pulled out onto Highway 321 towards Interstate 75.

Deputy Hall witnessed the vehicle cross into the emergency lane two times in less than 1/8th of a mile.

The Nissan abruptly slowed down and turned into the parking lot of the Marathon Gas Station with Hall right behind him. He was identified as Dustin McCollister.

Mr. McCollister had slurred speech, heavy eyes and when he exited his vehicle he was unsteady on his feet. While


he and the deputy were talking, McCollister was swaying back and forth and side to side. He failed all sobriety tasks and almost fell several times while trying to perform them.


Mr. McCollister had trouble following directions and stated he took seizure medication and adderall. After placing him under arrest, Deputy Hall discovered a bottle of xanax in his pocket. At first, Mr. McCollister said he hadn't taken any xanax, then he said he'd

had them filled that day and had only taken one.

The deputy noted in his report, the bottle contained only a small amount of xanax, well below the number that had been filled. Deputy Hall found a cut straw used to snort crushed pills in McCollister's wallet. Two more cut straws were discovered in a cigarette pack.

McCollister gave a blood sample at Fort Loudoun ER before going to jail.

Mr. Davis reportedly




