Mr. Jamison further advised he was missing a 12 inch Lowe Auger from the construction site.


The total estimated value of the loss was \$550. The case was turned over to an investigator.

dispatched to the intersection occurred he was driving the blue Oldsmobile Cutlass Supreme involved in the accident at 75 mph in a 40 mph speed zone.



Yokley, LCSO bserved the driver of a ald Pontiac Bonneville of wearing his seat belt on McGhee Boulevard Gear Highway 321. The vehicle was stopped in he Mcdonalds parking lot and the driver idenified as Marc Howard. Howard's passenger was Amanda Stevens.

While Lt. Yokley was issuing a citation to Mr. Howard for not wearing his seat belt, Deputy Chris Jenkins, LCSO deployed his K9 partner Diego around the vehicle. Deputy Jenkins advised his partner alerted to the vehicle.

While searching the car, a metal pill contain-

er was found in the seat that had been occupied by Amanda Stevens. Inside the container were 6 round blue pills with the markings of Mylan A1 identified as 1 mg. alprazolam, and one piece of a pill believed to be suboxone.

When law enforcement searched the trunk they found a make-up bag containing two hypodermic needles, and in another make-up bag there were two plastic

bags containing coffee filters. Approximately 1 gram of white crystal like substance was found in the filters. A field test was done on the powder and it tested positive for methamphetamine.

Amanda Stevens was the owner of the vehicle and the bags inside it. She was arrested and transported to the Loudon County Jail. Corporal Chad Estes, LCSO was also on scene.

without paying for two large packages of Chamin toilet paper valued at \$31.98.

The lawman noted in his affidavit Walden is from Loudon County and had no identification on her at the time

of the incident. Also, a citation was not issued because the offense (of theft) would have likely continued.

Walden reportedly is no stranger to Knox County authorities. She boasts at least three

convictions for theft by shoplifting and theft of property after pleading guilty to one of the crimes on March 15, 2010 and two others on February 22, 2011. All convictions came the admonishment to stay out of Knox County Wal Marts and Knox County Target stores.

Walden is scheduled to appear in court in Knox County July 6, 2011 on two counts of violation of probation for the shoplifting convictions and to face a preliminary hearing on her latest charge of theft of property-conduct involving merchandise.
