state's public healthcare insurance program.

The Office of Inspector General (OIG) today announced the arrest of Alpha Clark, alias Alpha Dee Fossett, 64. An indictment accuses her of falsifying her TennCare application and reverification documents by saying she lived in Tennessee, even though she had moved to Georgia. The charges cover a period from October 1, 2009 through February 9, 2011.

Clark is charged with four counts of TennCare fraud, three counts of identity theft and three counts of obtaining a controlled substance by fraud. In addition to the charges related to residency, she is ac-

cused of presenting three prescriptions for the painkillers Roxicodone, Oxycodone, and Percocet that were written under the name and DEA number of a physician without authorization.

In September 2009, Clark was convicted in Georgia of distribution of the painkiller Oxycodone. She was on probation for that conviction during the time she is alleged to have committed the offenses in Tennessee.

"We intend to prosecute anyone, regardless of where they live, if they lie to get enrolled in TennCare," Inspector General Deborah Faulkner said. "People who cross the state line to gain a benefit available to Tennesseans aren't just

stealing – they're hurting the TennCare program."

TennCare fraud is a Class E felony, carrying a sentence of up to two years in prison per charge. Attempting to obtain a controlled substance by fraud and identity theft both are Class D felonies carrying a sentence of up to four years in prison per charge. District Attorney General William H. Cox, III is prosecuting.

The OIG, which is separate from TennCare, began full operation in February 2005 and has investigated cases leading to over \$3.5 million paid in restitution and recoupment to TennCare, with a total estimated cost avoidance of over \$173 million for the TennCare program, according to latest figures. To date, nearly 1,500 people have been charged with TennCare fraud.

Through the OIG Cash for Tips Program established by the Legislature, Tennesseans can get cash rewards for TennCare fraud tips that lead to convictions. Anyone can report suspected TennCare fraud by calling 1-800-433-3982 toll-free from anywhere in Tennessee, or log on to www.tn.gov/tnoig and follow the prompts that read "Report TennCare Fraud."

Johnson

charged with theft under \$500 and violation of probation.

According to records, on Thursday, a manager at Food City saw Mr. Johnson selecting, opening and concealing various items throughout the store. After he opened the items, Mr. Johnson concealed them in his pants pocket and proceeded to exit the store, attempting to deprive the store of it's merchandise.

The total amount of the items concealed was \$74.34 and Food City is seeking restitution on \$69.96, the amount of items actually opened.

Mr. Johnson also had two outstanding violation of probation warrants against him at the time of the incident.

Officer Dennis Guider, LCPD answered the call and made the arrest Thursday.

Butler and the victim. Deputy Butler asked Ms. Green to calm down and she did, and agreed to leave with her sister, as long as she could retrieve some belongings.


Ms. Green retrieved some property and exited the house. She then approached the victim and struck him in the face with a plastic bag of maxi pads and started cursing him again.

Mr. Sarten stated he didn't know where the pills came from and he didn't know who Christy Andrews was.


Deputy Bowen's investigation of the domestic disturbance revealed Sarten had gone to another residence the night before and when he returned he appeared to be under the influence

of an intoxicant. He was yelling, screaming, and cussing all parties in the residence.

When he woke up Thursday he again became enraged and threatening to all parties in the residence. He threw items in the bedroom and attempted to cut off all phone communications from the residence.

Mr. Sarten then stated, "If authorities were called, this is what would happen," and he took out a cigarette lighter and set the bed on fire, stating he "would burn down the house and kill them all."

Both parties stated they were in fear of grave bodily injury and or death by Mr. Sarten's actions. He was then placed into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

her left eye. During the assault, Mr. Matlock also struck the child, whom she was holding.


Mr. Matlock then forcefully removed the woman's pocketbook from her arm, then he and Ms. Kilby retreated to their vehicle and fled the scene.

Emilie Jane Kyker, 27, Knox Street Philadelphia was charged with manufacturing methamphetamine, possession of drug paraphernalia, and aggravated child endangerment.

Dondra Kay Pitts, 'aka' Dondra Kay Batson, 36, also of Knox Street, was charged with manufacturing methamphetamine, possession of drug paraphernalia, aggravated child endangerment x 2, and possession of alprazolam.

According to records, Friday, around 12:00 PM, the Loudon County Sheriff's Office Narcotics Unit conducted a search warrant at the residence of Emilie Jane Kyker. During the search of the residence, a blue duffel bag was found in a hole in the floor of one of the children's room. The duffel bag contained two "one pot" or "shake and bake" bottles, a bottle containing acid fashioned into a gas generator, several pieces of tubing, a pill grinder, a bottle of Drano, sulfuric acid, a bottle of salt, numerous coffee filters, a plastic baggie containing a white powder that field

tested positive for ephedrine, and several other items commonly used to manufacture methamphetamine. A respirator, box of latex gloves, a box of insta-cold packs, a can of "Heat" starting fluid, plates with cut straws and razor blades, and aluminum foil fashioned in a way to smoke methamphetamine were found inside the residence.

Emilie Jane Kyker lives at the residence with her 6 year old son and another female, identified as Dondra Kay Pitts. Ms. Pitts advised she has two children who live there who are ages 9 and 11. Twenty-seven blue pills identified as 1 mg. alprazolam were found inside a bottle belonging to Dondra Pitts. Ms. Pitts could not produce a prescription for the alprazolam, a schedule IV
