

According to ports, Saturday, around 1:30 PM, Walmart loss prevention personnel observed Ms. Kile selecting various items throughout the store and concealing them inside her purse. She then picked out some jewelry and accessories, and wore them throughout the store before exiting the general merchandise door where she

was apprehended.

Ms. Kile attempted to deprive the store of merchandise totaling

merchandise totaling \$132.22. Walmart did not seek restitution.

Teresa Hawkins was stopped and searched by loss prevention for shoplifting a purse. It was discovered she was in possession of a snorting straw and a white powdery substance believed to be methamphetamine.

Stephanie Tallent was with Kile and Hawkins who were already in custody. While Officer Brown was talking with Ms. Tallent, he realized she was heavily under the influence of a substance. She consented to a search of her person and purse.

Tallent's purse contained a prescription bottle for ambien, which was prescribed to someone else. It contained 10 ambien pills and 6 cyclopenaprine hydrochloride pills.

Ms. Tallent performed field sobriety tasks that showed she was indeed under the influence of narcotics. Her speech was slurred and she swayed back and forth.

officers made 31 boating under the influence (BUI) arrests and cited 16 operators for reckless/negligent operation statewide over the 2011 July 4th holiday.

There were no reported fatalities from boating accidents, however TWRA officers statewide responded to several drowning calls that were found to be swimmingrelated. There were a total of six reported property damage accidents and five reported serious injury accidents. The holiday period ran from 6 p.m., Friday, July 1 through midnight, Monday, July 4.

In 2010, there was one-related boating accident which resulted in a fatality. TWRA officers made 28 BUI arrests during the 2010 July 4th holiday period

In 2011, there have been 13 boating-related fatalities, 34 serious injury accidents, and 29 reported property damage accidents. TWRA officers have made 81 BUIs this year.

Q.&A. about basic facts about free and reduced price meals:

Do you need to fill out an application for each of your children? No, you only need one application for all students in your household.

Who can get free meals? All children in households receiving benefits from SNAP or Families First can get free meals regardless of your income. Also, your children can get free meals if your household's gross income is within the free limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines.

Can foster children get free meals? Yes, foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court, are eligible for free meals. Any foster child in the household is eligible for free meals regardless of income.

Can homeless, runaway and migrant children get free meals? Yes, children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant qualify for free meals. Check with your school, the homeless liaison or migrant coordinator for more information and

to see if your children qualify.

Who can get reduced meals? Your children can get low cost meals if your household is within the reduced price limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines.

Should you fill out an application if you get a letter this school year saying your children are approved for free or reduced price meals? Read the letter carefully and follow the instructions, or call your local School Nutrition Program Director.

My child's application was approved last year. Do you need to fill out another one? Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year.

If you get WIC, can your children get free meals? Your children may be eligible for free or reduced price meals, but you will need to fill out an application.

Will the information you give be checked? Yes, and you may also be asked to send written proof.

What if you disagree with the school's decision about your application? You should talk to school officials, or you may also ask for a hearing by calling or writing the school officials.

May you apply if someone in your household is not a U.S. citizen? Yes. You or your children do not have to be U.S. citizens to qualify for free or reduced price meals.

Who should you include as members of your household? You must include all people living in your household, related or

not (such as grandparents, other relatives, or friends) who share income and expenses. You must include yourself and all children who live with you. If you live with other people who are economically independent, do not include them.

What if your income is not always the same? You must list the amount that you normally receive. If you normally get overtime, include it. But if you do not normally get it, do not include it. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.

If you are in the military, do you include your housing allowance as income? If you get an off-base housing allowance, you must include it as income. If your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income.

If my spouse is deployed to a combat zone, is the combat pay counted as income? No, if the combat pay is received in addition to the basic pay because of deployment and it was not received before the deployment, combat pay is not counted as income.

Jeremy Harrell Morgan, 30, Huntsville Hollow Road, Lenoir City was charged with public intoxication and possession of a controlled substance.

Arnold Ray Stringer Jr., 'aka' Ray Ray, also of Huntsville Hollow Road, was charged with public intoxication.

According to reports, LCPD Officers K. Sennett and Allen Bean were dispatched to Chili's Restaurant on Highway 321 Sunday night. Upon arrival, the officers observed Mr. Morgan and Mr. Stringer asleep at their table.

The drinks on the table appeared to be alcoholic beverages. Mr. Morgan had a silver container

containing two 30 mg. oxycodone and one xanax broken in half. Mr. Morgan verified what the pills were, but could not provide a prescription for them. At the time of the investigation, Mr. Morgan was chewing on a shortened straw approximately 3 inches long, which is commonly used for snorting crushed pills.

Morgan stated he had snorted pills earlier in the day. He had very glossy eyes, his pupils were extremely dilated and he had trouble staying awake.

Officer Sennett took Mr. Morgan into custody.

Once Mr. Stringer was awakened he seemed very confused, had glossy eyes and slurred speech. Mr. Stringer stated he took four oxycodone and three somas before going to Chili's and consuming alcohol.

Stringer was deemed a danger to himself and others and was taken into custody. Officer Bean made the arrest.
