


Detective Jack Fine arrested two local men Wednesday following an investigation into the larceny of a trailer and television from a Lenoir City residence over the weekend.

len from their residence. The rings had been hidden at a location in the home sometime prior to May 5th, 2011, for safe keeping, because Mr. and Mrs. Springer were leaving town on an extensive trip. The rings were forgotten about until August 8th, 2011, when they went to get them to have them appraised.

Prior to leaving on their trip,

Mr. and Mrs. Springer had furniture items delivered on May 5th, 2011 by a local company in Lenoir City, and having forgotten about the rings, the couple allowed two delivery people from the store to exchange the furniture without their supervision. The names of the delivery people were unknown but one of them signed a delivery invoice.

The couple advised they did not know for sure if the

delivery persons took the rings however, according to Mr. and Mrs. Springer, no one else had been in or at the residence, to their knowledge. The rings were in the same room as where the furniture was delivered.

The couple have thoroughly searched the residence for the missing rings and at the time of the report, had not found them.

The ladies ring was described as a 14K yellow gold, custom made ring with three brilliant cut diamonds and the man's ring was 14K yellow gold with a round brilliant cut diamond.

The total estimated value of the rings is \$19,000.

The theft was turned over to a investigator.

#### Thaxton

Wednesday, at approximately 10:50 PM, Officer Emily Lawson, LCPD responded to McGhee Square, Kelly Lane, Lenoir City in reference to an assault in progress. When Officer Lawson arrived on the scene with Lt. David Flynn, the accused had just left in a blue Ford Focus, according to witnesses.

The offender was identified as Dewayne Thaxton by numerous witnesses and the victim.

Lt. Flynn made contact with Thaxton at a residence on C Street. Officer Lawson made contact with the female victim, several witnesses and the complainant in the McGhee Square parking lot.

After speaking with everyone involved, as well as some impartial residents at the complex who witnessed part of the incident, it was determined Mr. Thaxton and the victim had ended their relationship that day and when Mr. Thaxton came to the apartment to get his belongings, he found the female at another apartment and told her he wanted his things from their apartment.

The victim, who is 6 1/2 months pregnant, advised she walked with Mr. Thaxton to their apartment. As she opened the door, Mr. Thaxton shoved her through the doorway and the two began arguing. Once inside the residence, Thaxton shoved her into the wall, then put both hands around her throat and pinned her to the wall.

The victim told the officer one of two females who had arrived with Mr. Thaxton pulled him off of her and took him outside, where the two continued to have a heated argument before he finally left.

Officer Lawson noted in her report she observed red marks on both sides of the victim's neck that could be consistent with the events. Mr. Thaxton was determined to be the primary aggressor and placed under arrest.

Ms. Kern's sister had a knot on the left side of her head, a scratch on the right side of her leg and her left cheek was swollen.


Ms. Kern had an injury to a fingernail on her right hand. It was determined that Rachelle Kern was the primary aggressor. She was arrested and duly charged.
