Did you know? On filing eviction in Tennessee: If the tenant is gone for 30 days without paying rent and without notifying you, you may consider the property abandoned. In addition, if you have a written lease, it could require the tenant to tell you if the tenant is going to be gone more than seven days. When the tenant abandons the dwelling and leaves personal property behind, you have certain rights to dispose of the property. However, you also have certain duties; so it would be a good idea to consult a lawyer before destroying or selling the property. If you evict a tenant or cut off services without a court order, the tenant may sue you for damages--and you might have to pay the tenant's lawyer. (Rentlaw.com The National Landlord Tenant : Guide)

#### Precautions

"Swimming is a great way to exercise, and offers numerous health benefits," said Health Commissioner Susan R. Cooper, MSN, RN. "We want to remind everyone to take common sense precautions to protect their families from illnesses that can be spread in water and help keep swimming fun and healthy."

Water III-Recreational nesses, or RWIs, are caused by germs that are spread by swallowing or having other contact with contaminated water in places such as swimming pools, water parks, hot tubs, interactive fountains, lakes, rivers, springs, ponds or oceans. RWIs cause several types of symptoms, including gastrointestinal, skin, ear, respiratory, eye, neurologic and wound infections. The most commonly reported RWI is diarrhea. Even healthy swimmers can get sick from RWIs, but the young, elderly, pregnant women and those with weakened immune systems are especially at risk.

"When swimming in treated water such as a pool or water park, keep in mind that germs on and in swimmers' bodies end up in the water and can make other people sick," said State Epidemiologist Tim F. Jones, MD. "The best way

to prevent RWIs is to keep germs out of the pool in the first place."

Tennesseans help can keep our swimming destinations safe by following these healthy swimming steps.

- Wash your child thoroughly (especially the rear end) with soap and water before swimming. Invisible amounts of fecal matter can end up in the pool.
- Don't swim if you have diarrhea.
- Practice good hygiene. Shower with soap before swimming and wash your hands after using the toilet or changing diapers.
- Take children on frequent bathroom breaks and/or check diapers often. Change diapers in a bathroom or diaper-changing area, not at poolside.

Bodies of water such as lakes, rivers and streams often contain some degree of bacteria. When swimming in streams, lakes or ponds, swim only in water that is not stagnant, has no significant algae or foam and is not polluted by livestock or waterfowl. Avoid swimming after heavy rainfalls or in areas identified as unsafe by TDOH or the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation. TDEC provides a list of water advisories online at http://

Illnesses and outbreaks associated with recreational water vary from year to year. In 2010, there were no outbreaks caused by recreational water reported in Tennessee. Nationwide, illness caused by cryptosporidium and other waterborne pathogens such as E. coli and Norwalk-like viruses has been on the rise.

Regardless of the type of water you are swimming in, try not to swallow the water. Even treated water can still contain pathogens. If symptoms of gastrointestinal distress occur within a few days of swimming, contact your health care provider and consider having your stool tested for pathogens. Any illness or outbreak that is possibly caused by exposure to recreational water should be reported to your local health department.

charged with promotion of methamphetamine manufacture and unlawful possession of a weapon.


According to reports, Of-

ficer Kevin Condee, LCPD was conducting surveillance at the Walgreens Pharmacy in Lenoir City Friday and observed David E. Winder purchasing pseudoephedrine at the pharmacy counter and followed him outside the store. After Officer Condee identified himself as an officer, Mr. Winder consented to having a conversation with him, and also let him check his identification.

A computer database check showed Winder had an extensive history of purchasing pseudoephedrine, including the purchase of over 10 grams in the month of June, 2011. Mr. Winder was advised of his Miranda Rights and admitted he purchased the pseudoephedrine for the purpose of selling either the entire box for \$75 or half the box for \$30. Winder also advised earlier that day he'd purchased another box of pseudoepohedrine from the Rite Aid in Loudon and was intending to sell it as well. Mr. Winder stated the person he was selling it to was using it to produce methamphetamine, but he himself was only using methamphetamine and not manufacturing it.

During an inventory search of Winder's vehicle, the officer found a loaded 6.35 mm semi-auto pistol under the driver's floor mat. Winder does not possess a handgun carry permit.

Winder was placed under arrest and transported to the Loudon County Jail.






