Man indicted for rape of The Good News


Chid Loudon

(CID) and the Department of Children's Services (DCS) began an investigation of Hornby involving the rape of





Hornby was arrested August 15th by the Loudon CID unit in Knoxville without incident and was brought to the Loudon County Jail. He remains in custody at this time under a \$25,000 bond.

If convicted, Hornby would face mandatory

prison time.






