





A Loudon man was jailed after he reportedly beat up a female and stole her vehicle when he became enraged at the breakup of their relationship.

Nathan Brandon Underwood, 23, Vale Street, Loudon, was charged with domestic assault, theft over \$1000 and felony vandalism.

According to affidavits; on August 8th, 2011, Corporal Ernie Brown, LCSO was dispatched to Shaw Ferry Road on a report of an assault and vandalism, and the theft of a vehicle. The complainant stated her ex-boyfriend, Nathan B. Underwood became enraged

because they broke up. He struck her and threatened to hit and spit on others at the scene.

The victim also said Underwood broke the hatch window of her vehicle and kicked and hit the passenger's side several times. There was broken tinted glass in the driveway.

Underwood then took the victim's vehicle without her permission. The vehicle was located at Mr. Underwood's parents house and did have a broken hatch window and two dents that still had shoe prints on them. Mr. Underwood had left the residence, taking the complainant's keys with him.


Investigator Jeff Russell, LCSO-CID was contacted and responded to process the scene. The total estimated value of the loss was \$670. The case is under investigation.
