Loudon County Woman Charged with TennCare "Doctor Shopping"

NASHVILLE – A Loudon County woman is charged with TennCare fraud involving "doctor shopping," or using TennCare public healthcare insurance to go to multiple doctors in a short time period to obtain controlled substances.

The Office of Inspector General (OIG), with assistance from the Loudon County Sheriff's Office, today announced the arrest of Daphine L. Webb, 31, of Lenoir City. She is named in an indictment charg-

An elderly woman went to the Justice Center Thursday to report the larceny of over \$6000 in jewelry she said she thought might have been taken from her residence several weeks ago.





ing her with two counts of fraudulently using TennCare obtain controlled substances by "doctor shopping." Webb failed to disclose to her healthcare providers that she had seen other physicians within a 30-day period and received prescriptions for the painkillers Endocet and Lortab with the clinical visits and prescriptions being paid for by TennCare.

"Providers, local law enforcement and state agencies are simply no longer tolerating this kind of abuse of TennCare, especially when it relates to adprescription dictive painkillers," Inspector General Deborah Y. Faulkner said. "We're intent on prosecuting every one of these cases

to the fullest extent possible anytime TennCare is involved."

TennCare fraud involving doctor shopping is a Class E felony carrying a sentence of up to two years per charge in prison. District Attorney General Russell Johnson is prosecuting.

operation in February 2005 and has investigated cases leading to over \$3.5 million paid in restitution and recoupment to TennCare, with a total estimated cost avoidance of over \$173 million for the TennCare program, according to latest figures. To date, nearly 1,500 people have been fraud.





Ohio, and West Virginia in forming a multistate alliance to fight prescription drug abuse on several fronts.

enforcement Law officials consider prescription drug abuse an increasing problem in Tennessee, which consistently ranks as one of the top states in the country for the use of prescribed medications. According to the Tennessee Drug Diversion Task Force, in 2009 Tennessee ranked second in the nation with 17:3 retail prescriptions written per person compared with a national average of 12.0. Since 2008 the top three controlled substances prescribed in Tennessee have been the pain medications Hydrocodone, Alprazolam, and Oxycodone.

Another problem is Tennessee's close proximity to other states. borders Tennessee eight states, and five major interstates run through it, making it a major drug trafficking

corridor.

Department of Safety and Homeland Security Commissioner Bill Gibbons believes it is imperative to join other states to fight prescription drug abuse. "This is a battle Tennessee can't fight by itself. We are seeing an increasing number of prescription drugs coming in from other states on our interstates, especially I-75. We must join forces with neighboring states to fight this problem head on," Commissioner Gibbons said. Gibbons heads the Governor's public

safety sub-cabinet working group which is developing a statewide plan to tackle several public safety concerns, including prescription drug abuse.

At Wednesday's meeting, representatives from each state discussed prescription drug monitoring, treatment for addiction, educational strategies, and accurate data collection. Further meetings will include discussions on multi-state goals and initiatives to curb the influx of illegal prescription drugs as well as ways to better share information and resources between the states.

The Tennessee Department of Safety and Homeland Security's mission is (www.TN.Gov/safety) to ensure the safety and general welfare of the public. The department encompasses the Tennessee Highway Patrol, Office of Homeland Security and Driver License Services. General areas of responsibility include law enforcement, safety education, motorist services and terrorism prevention.
