



Following the aforementionedconversation the undercover placed a recorded phone call to Wiggins. During the conversation Wiggins describes his body features to the undercover and tells him to say he was 18 years old. Wiggins made several sexual comments and could be heard moaning by the undercover as Wiggins told him to talk him through this and then stated, "you know what I mean".

Wiggins again attempted to invite the undercover to his house and ultimately told the undercover to "take a picture of himself and send it to him". It is believed the child following through with Wiggins request to come to his residence would have completed this act of solicitation. The result would have been a statutory rape and exploitation of a minor.

On September 26, 2012 Sgt. Jason Butler and the 9th Judicial District Drug Task Force Internet Crimes Against Children task force executed a search warrant at the residence of Chris Wiggins, on Martel Road. During the search officers

found a clear plastic bag containing a small amount of a green leafy substance believed to be marijuana.

Also during search officers found three firearms in Wiggin's bedroom along with ammunition. Wiggins is a convicted felon and currently on state probation.

Christopher Harold Wiggins, 36, of Martel Road, Lenoir City, was charged with solicitation of a minor (sexual activity involving a minor), solicitation of a minor (statutory rape), felon in possession of firearms and possession of schedule VI. Sgt. Jason Butler, LCPD made the arrest and filed the charges.

sidered flammable, toxic, reactive and/or corrosive and should not be placed with regular garbage.


Typical items to dispose of include cleaning fluids, pesticides, mercury thermometers and thermostats, fluorescent bulbs, lithium and button batteries, aerosols, adhesives, medications, brake fluid, swimming pool chemicals and paint thinner. Items not accepted include ammunition, explosives, alkaline batteries, paint, electronics, medical waste and any items from a school, commercial business or agri-business.

Many counties and municipalities meet the needs of local residents by providing collection of batteries, oil, paint, antifreeze and electronic scrap - or BOPAE as it is sometimes called. 1-800-287-9013 or visit When handled correctly, these BOPAE materials

minimally hazardous, but inappropriate for collection at household hazardous waste events. Contact your local city or county solid waste department to find BOPAE collection sites in 'your area.

When transporting materials to the site, place containers in sturdy boxes lined with newspaper to prevent spills and cross-contamination in the trunk of a car or back of a truck. Be sure to keep materials away from children and pets. Materials should be kept in the original container whenever possible. If not, place the waste in a plastic jug with a secure lid and label its contents.
