



Also in the bathroom sink was a broken razor used to make lacerations to Broyles' arm. There was a pool of blood near the bathtub.

EMS responded and Broyles was transported to Sweetwater Hospital for a mental evaluation.

The deputy then spoke to the victim, who reported she and Broyles had been in a physical altercation during an argument. She stated Broyles has another child with another female and that he sent or received nude

Cherokee National Forest, Cherohala Skyway, and historic trails. The Visitor Center will also serve as a trailhead for the existing Duck Pond Trail and provide a pedestrian link to the central business district, while also creating a needed outdoor plaza in the downtown area.

"If a town or city is going to thrive, then its downtown must be its heart, and these improvements increase the sense of community and will provide valuable resources to thousands of visitors," Haslam said. "This project will provide connectivity between Sweetwater's recreational areas and its downtown, as well as provide new opportunities for pedestrians and cyclists."

The grant is made possible through a federally funded program administered by the Tennessee Department of Transportation.

"Through Transpor-Enhancement tation grants, TDOT has funded more than \$270 million in non-traditional transportation projects," said TDOT Commissioner John Schroer. "This program has assisted communities all over the state in their efforts to revitalize downtowns, highlight historic areas, provide alternative means of transportation, and increase opportunities for economic development."

A variety of activities were original photo such as the restoration of historic facilities, bike and pedestrian trails, landscaping and non-traditional other

transportation projects are eligible for grant funds under the federal program.

ber and November to give citizens additional opportunities to obtain photo identification in order to vote in the upcoming state and federal general election. The centers were chosen based on the size of the populations they serve and the response from citizens to centers that were opened on Saturdays before the primary election.

A new state law effective this year requires citizens to present a federal or state-issued photo ID to vote at the polls. The law also requires the Department of Safety and Homeland Security to issue photo IDs for voting purposes at no charge.

As of October 1, 2012, the Department of Safety and Homeland Security had issued 22,933 photo IDs for voting purposes. The vast majority (21,468) of those issued were non-photo driver licenses converted into photo driver licenses, while 1,465 identification cards.

There eight driver service centers will be open from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. on

Saturday, October 6 and Saturday, November 3. The centers will issue voter photo IDs and convert non-photo driver licenses into photo driver licenses only. No other services will be available during these special hours.

Locally, the following driver service center will provide this special Saturday service: Knox County, 7320 Region Lane, Knoxville, TN 37914.

To minimize the possibility of wait times during Saturday hours, groups or organizations planning to make a group visit to a driver service center should schedule an appointment by calling Melissa Long at 865-712-4908 (east Tennessee contact).


