

Even with mistakes, I also feel like we did a lot of things right. We showed these babies love as a family, what it means to love God and how a husband and wife should love one another. I was there for proms, sports activities, graduations, college applications and first days of college. I have laughed with them, cried with them, gotten aggravated at them – everything a parent does. We have supported them financially, emotionally and pray for them daily.

I don't share that to be boastful because there are parents, step-parents, grandparents, etc. all over the world who are doing that and more. When I fell in love with Jeff, I fell in love with those babies. It wouldn't have worked any other way. Through thick and thin – good times and bad times – they are my family.

We were recently given the opportunity to bring in yet another teenager to our home. Even though she is not technically ours, we feel like God placed her in our lives to show her the love of Jesus and equip her with the same opportunities that our children received. We are all still adjusting to this addition in our family, and we covet your prayers that we will love her as God has instructed us to love everyone.

As a woman who had

no children just a few years ago, and now is responsible for four; I can tell you that I have been truly blessed. Throughout this journey as a new mom, I have shared seasons of joy and pain with each of them. There have been days they loved me and days they could kill me (at least with their eyes).

Even though I have given them everything I have and every piece of my heart, I have always known one thing to remain true with each of these kids. There is nothing like a child's love for their mother. I don't admit that truth begrudgingly or out of disrespect to anyone. These babies have become more than step-children to me. They are my friends and my life. For that, I am thankful!

Over the past few weeks, I have had a burden for a friend who has a severe alcohol addiction. I have prayed for this woman and her children. I have tried talking to her. I even tried taking her to a women's conference that addressed drug, alcohol and sexual addictions. My friend continues to make excuses that she doesn't have a problem. She continues to say that she will quit drinking once she "gets a grip on things". The sad part is, I have known her for over five years, and she still doesn't "have a grip on things".

Her children are hurting and need a mother who can be there for them; not just come in drunk and bark orders from time to time. Her babies are gradually losing respect for her authority and are in an extremely lonely place right now.

I know addictions are

tough and we never know the extent of pain that a person has gone through. I do know this: we have a Savior who can take all pain and hurt away. He can deliver anyone from any addiction.

*"I Peter 5:6-11 NKJV
6 Therefore humble yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time, 7 casting all your care upon Him, for He cares for you. 8 Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour. 9 Resist him, steadfast in the faith, knowing that the same sufferings are experienced by your brotherhood in the world. 10 But may the God of all grace, who called us to His eternal glory by Christ Jesus, after you have suffered a while, perfect, establish, strengthen, and settle you. 11 To Him be the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen."*

Hurting mother, struggling father, I beg you, if you are struggling with an addiction that is effecting your walk with the Lord, your family or your children, come to Jesus. For

those of you blessed to have children, they are a gift from God. Even though I can guarantee that they will love you unconditionally, they also want and need your love just as much.



The man was identi-

Also in the group was a woman identified as Darlene Ellis Shepard and she had a box of pseudoephedrine in her possession. Ms. Shepard also stated to the officer the intended use for the product was making meth and she had not yet negotiated a price for the box. Shepard was taken into custody and transported to jail.

The third person, David Tremaine Hunter was found with a box of pseudoephedrine as well and knew of its intended use. Mr. Hunter also has a history of pseudoephedrine and was taken into custody and transported to jail.

David Tremaine Hunter, 42, of Northfork Road, Madisonville; Darlene Ellis Shepard, 51, of Southard St., Tellico Plains and Terry Lynn Martin, 49, of Mains Road, Madisonville, were charged with immediate meth
