When a local man told a buddy about a West Broadway resident getting his pain pills, the two men along with a third person allegedly hatched up a scheme to rob the patient of his pills, then reportedly used a loaded gun and pair of brass knuckles to execute their plan. All three, however, were found out after the gun wielding suspect was apprehended running from the residence with his weapon and the three were subsequently charged with the crime.




5, 2012, Randall Brown and Jeremy Lynn Galyon went to a residence on West Broadway and kicked the door in. Once

inside Galyon pointed a loaded .22 caliber rifle at the victim and demanded he give him his Oxycodone.

Randall Brown en-

tered the residence with Galyon. Brown had brass knuckles on his hand and was wearing a black shirt, black pants and toboggan over his

head and face. The victim poured the pills in the hand of Randall Brown and both suspects left.

Upon arrival at the scene, Lt. David Flynn observed Jeremy Lynn Galyon running from the area with a rifle in his hand. After a short chase, Galyon was apprehended and the rifle was recovered. Galyon had 10 of the Oxycodones with him in his pocket.

Galyon is a convicted felon and is prohibited from possessing a firearm. Randall Dale Brown admitted to doing the robbery.

Another warrant filed by Detective Sartin indicated James Chadwick Kleiber gave information to Jeremy Galyon about the victim getting his pain pills, then supplied him with a weapon and a ride. Jeremy Galyon and Randall Brown took the information and robbed the victim.




