



consent from Capshaw to search the residence and vehicle at 432 Mason Lane and Capshaw gave written consent to search.

Capshaw showed investigators a clear plastic bag with several off white rock like substances believed to be crack cocaine inside a baseball bag in the garage of the residence.

The baggie was collected and the white rock like substances was weighed at 4.6 grams. When Capshaw was apprehended, a small baggie of green plant material believed to be marijuana was

taken from his hands. After being collected as evidence the plant material weighed 1.1 grams. In the cup holder area of Capshaw's vehicle, a small baggie with an off white rock like substance believed to be crack cocaine was found along with under \$19 in currency in the same area. The small baggie of off white rock substance weighed 1.1 grams. \$370 in currency was found near Capshaw's wallet inside the center console of the vehicle. All the currency found in the vehicle was seized totaling \$389.



ber thinking how cool it would be to actually get paid for doing that. One day, one shift, had an impact on me that resulted in a career of almost twenty years now in police service. I'm not sure if I should thank Bobby or if I should send him hate mail! I'm kidding, I still love police work and Bobby. He too loves Jesus and his life reflects it.

More importantly though is mine and Angie's decision about a year ago to surrender all aspects of our lives to Christ. We knew we wanted to serve the Lord but wasn't sure what that should really look like; that is until we were introduced to "Preacher Mark", true Bible study and a couple of other life changing books that are based on God's Word.

The first is a book called "Radical" Dr. David Platt. David Platt is the pastor of the Church at Brook Hills in Birmingham, Alabama. In his book "Radical" he describes living a life that is totally committed to Jesus. He believes that the instructions, directions and examples Jesus gave to His disciples were not just meant for the first century but for all who accept Christ. David Platt understands that to be sold out to Jesus means that one may be labeled as a religious freak or religious radical. He is leading his church and many others into radical abandonment for Jesus in an attempt to spread the gospel to all nations as we are told in Mathew 28:18-20. He challenges Christians to what he calls the one year "Radical Experiment". Angie

and I have accepted this challenge and God is already blessing our lives more than you can imagine. The "Radial Experiment is as follows; Over the next year......

- 1. Pray for the entire world
- 2. Read through the entire Word
- 3. Sacrifice our money for a specific purpose for Christ

Jesus commanded us to love our neighbors, to be His witnesses and to make disciples of all nations. Dr. Platt believes that radical surrender, radical obedience, radical giving, radical going and radical serving is what Jesus expects from us and if we were all following the commands of

Christ this type of lifestyle wouldn't be called radical at all. I want to be that kind of Christian.

Angie and I also found that Francis Chan "Got it" long before we did. He wrote a short book named "Crazy Love" that describes and gives awesome biblical ex-

amples of what our love for Jesus should look like. Francis Chan is the pastor of Cornerstone Church in Simi Valley, California. I used to think that California was only the land of fruits and nuts until I read what God is doing through


