





Mr. Davis took off running in an attempt to elude law enforcement. He continued running behind businesses and along the railroad tracks up to Highland Avenue where Officer Brandon Nix, LPD made contact with him, but he ran from Officer Nix up Highland Avenue.

In the meantime, Officer Bryan E. Blakney, LPD pulled up, got out of his vehicle and started chasing after Davis. Blakney yelled twice, identifying himself as a police officer, and ordered Davis to stop running or he would be Tased.

Officer Nix continued trying to place restraints on Mr. Davis and when Officer Blakney advised him he was about to be Tased again, Davis complied and was placed under arrest.




