





According to reports, Corporal Michael Watkins, LCSO was dispatched to the 18000 block of Pond Creek Road Thursday in reference to an automobile accident. On arrival, the deputy observed a blue Oldsmobile Cutlass in a ditch and a man climbing out of the vehicle. He was identified as Jimmy D. Ratliff.

When Mr. Ratliff was putting his license back into his wallet a razor blade fell out of it and he placed his foot on it in an attempt to hide it.

Corporal Watkins asked if he had anything else in or on his person and asked permission to pat him down. Mr. Ratliff ran his right hand into his pocket and Corporal Watkins grabbed if due to safety

hand back out and when Il meth, promotion of he did a clear baggy with a white powder residue fell out of his pocket. At that time Mr. Ratliff was detained and searched.

The substance in the baggy later field' tested positive as meth and weighed approximately

4 grams.

A large plastic baggy with white powder inside, weighing approximately 10 grams was field tested as pseudophedrine, coffee filters with powder residue, a black bag with approximately 100 pieces of tightly wrapped aluminum foil, two glass pipes with residue, 3 pieces of 2 mg. xanax, and 1.5 pill of 5 mg. xanax were found in Ratliff's pocket.

During inventory of the vehicle a bottle of Red Fire drain opener was found wrapped in 3 bags and hidden inside a backpack in the car.

Mr. Ratliff was taken into custody and duly charged.

While the officer was issuing a warning citation, Lt. Paul Curtis LCSO-ND, deployed K9 Deacon to conduct a K9 sniff of the vehicle and the K9 gave a positive alert to the odor of narcotics coming from inside the vehicle. An empty prescription bottle, which had been filled that day with forty 30 mg. oxycodone, was found under the driver's seat.

Two cut pieces of a straw with a powder residue, which are commonly used to ingest illegal narcotics were found in Ms. Brown's wallet. Another prescription bottle belonging to Ms. Brown, also filled that day for eighty 30 mg oxycodone, was found in her purse. The bottle contained 77 small round blue pills identified as 30 mg oxycodone.

A prescription bottle belonging to Mr. Romano was found in his front pants

pocket. The prescription was for one hundred fifty 30 mg oxycodone filled on February 17, 2012, at a pharmacy in Loudon. The bottle contained thirty eight small round blue pills identified as oxycodone.

Investigator Ezell contacted the pharmacy to inquire which manufacturer and brand of oxycodone they dispensed. The pharmacy told the investigator what company and brand they used and described the color, shape and the markings on the pills.

A mirandized interview with Ms. Brown was conducted and she advised she'd picked up her prescription from Walgreens at approximately 12:45 PM, and took 1 1/2 pills when she picked them up. Then Ms. Brown and Mr. Romano went to Calhouns to eat and when they left she took another 1 1/2 of the oxygodone.

Ms. Brown reportedly advised Mr. Romano asked if he could have a couple of her pills and she said yes. Ms. Brown told him to get them out of her bottle while she was driving and that's when they were stopped by law enforcement.

A mirandized interview with Mr. Romano was conducted and he stated he was counting Ms. Brown's pills

and he spilled the pills and placed them in his bottle. He further stated he only uses the one pharmacy in Loudon and is prescribed 30 mg oxycodone.

Brown and Romano were taken into custody and transported to the Jail.




