

According to records, Agent Brendan DeBoer, of the 9th Drug Task Force, was contacted by a pharmacist at the Mulberry Street Pharmacy in Loudon in reference to a suspicious prescription called into the pharmacy Tuesday. for tramadol, a schedule IV narcotic and was for 90 pills.

The pharmacist attempted to verify the doctor whom it was supposedly called in by, but was unsuccessful. The pharmacist called

Agent DeBoer and told him a female by the name of Erica Smith was attempting to fill what he believed to be a fraudulent prescription.

Agent DeBoer reported he was familiar with Mrs. Smith from interviewing and arresting her in the last 60 days for calling in and filling fraudulent prescriptions of tramadol at Loudon area pharmacies.

to have impersonated a licensed professional by calling in the prescription as a doctor, thus she obtained drugs by fraud and was in possession of tramadol.


Mrs. Smith is currently on bond for obtaining drugs by fraud. She was arrested and trans-





ated with the control of wild hogs in the state. The commission has asked the TWRA to readdress the current limit of non-family designees

well as updates associ- as related to wild hog control efforts on large acreage tracts.

Also, establish no less than a 10-day period whereby the state will partner with the public in


its wild hog control efforts on Catoosa Wildlife Management Area and other WMAs deemed appropriate. This period would allow for the use of dogs by the public in its assistance to the agency. It would be appropriate for the staff to recommend how the period would be implemented, including the 10 days not necessarily being consecutive in consideration to the WMA's other activities and seasons.

The commission approved a rule amendment to the Rules and Regulations for Animal

Importation-Importation of Wildlife Carcasses, Parts and Products. This rule prohibits the unauthorized importation of any cervid carcasses or parts that are from areas where Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) has been identified. This is being put in place to prevent the introduction of Chronic Wasting Disease into Tennessee's wild white-tailed deer and elk populations, as well as captive non-native deer and elk populations.


