
The Tennessee Department of Health, in cooperation with the PPAW Spay/Neuter Clinic will hold 2 Rabies Clinics.


Saturday, April 28 – Loudon High School Both Clinics will be held from 9:00 am to 12:00 noon. The cost is \$10 for a one-year vaccination and
