Detective Jonathan Sartin arrested a Loudon family on multiple theft charges in connection with a series of larcenies they allegedly committed at Walmart over the space of a week.


Dana Barnes Hurst, 48, Simpson Road, Loudon, was charged with three counts of theft under \$500.

The following day, March 21, 2012, Dana and Dean Hurst went to Walmart and put oil, bed skirts and sheets in foam bed top, and air their buggy and pushed

it out of the store past all points of sale without paying for the merchandise. The total amount was \$107.82.

The family then made another trip to Walmart on March 27, 2012, when all three Hursts went to the retail giant. Records indicate Dana and Dean put an air conditioner, purifier into the buggy,

and their daughter Abbie took a pair of \$5.45 sunglasses from a rack and put them in her mother's buggy.

The trio then pushed the cart out of the store past all points of sale, again without paying for their merchandise. The total amount of the theft was \$331.85.

Detective Sartin made the arrests Thursday at Walmart.
