





Officer Bobby Lankford, LPD made the arrest at the Log Cabin on Highway 72.


David Morton Williams, 50, West Fourth Avenue, Lenoir City was charged with violation of probation out of Loudon County and failure to appear out of Knox County.






To set at liberty those who are oppressed; To proclaim the acceptable year of The Lord.






