

Insectinvasion growing; EAB Quarantine Expanded to 5 New Counties in ET

NASHVILLE - Emerald Ash Borer, an invasive insect that destroys ash trees, has been found in Anderson, Hamblen, Hancock, Hawkins and Roane counties. These areas are all adjacent to counties already under an EAB quarantine. The

identification was made recently and has been confirmed by USDA.

"We are continuing our surveys to determine the extent of the infestation," said Gray Haun, TDA Plant Certification Administrator. "We will

EAB attacks only ash trees. It is believed to have been introduced into the Detroit, Mich. area 15 to 20 years ago

In response to the find, TDA is adding the 5 new counties to the Emerald Ash Borer quarantine. Blount, Claiborne, Grainger, Knox, Loudon and Sevier counties are already under an EAB quarantine. The quarantine prohibits the movement of firewood, ash nursery stock, ash timber and other material that can spread EAB. With the new discovery, citizens can expect expanded surveys and should report any symptomatic ash trees to TDA.

"People located in surrounding areas to the quarantine can expect to see more purple traps this coming spring and summer as these are an important part of the surveying process," said Haun. "The traps are coated with an adhesive that captures insects when they land. The color is thought to be attractive to EAB, and is relatively easy for humans to spot among the foliage."

Typically, the Emerald Ash Borer beetles can kill an ash tree within three years of the initial infestation. Adults are dark green, one-half inch in length and one-eighth inch wide, and fly only from April until September, depending on the climate of the area. In Tennessee, most EAB adults would fly in May and June.

Larvae spend the rest of the year beneath the bark of ash trees. When they emerge as adults, they leave D-shaped holes in the bark about one-eighth inch wide.

The Tennessee Department of Agriculture Division of Forestry estimates that five million urban ash trees in Tennessee are potentially at risk from EAB. The risk represents an estimated value loss of \$2 billion. There are an estimated 261 million ash trees on Tennessee public and private timberland potentially valued as high as \$9 billion.

TDA urges area residents and visitors to help prevent the spread of EAB:

• Don't transport fire-wood, even within Ten-nessee. Don't bring firewood along for camping trips. Get the wood you need from a local source. Don't bring wood home with you.

Don't buy or move firewood from outside the state. When obtaining firewood, ask the vendor about the source, and don't buy wood from outside the state unless it states that it has been treated.

• Watch for signs of infestation in your ash trees. If you suspect your ash tree could be infested with EAB, visit www.TN.gov/agriculture/eab for a symptoms checklist and report form or call TDA's Regulatory Services Division at 1-800-628-2631.
