
Five injured by alleged drunk driver after ranning, followed by wreck

An eight year old boy and four other persons ranging in age from three years old to 30 were taken to UT Trauma Center for treatment following an incident at a Loudon convenience store. Teddy Eugene Grimes, 50, Upper Street, Loudon, was charged with DUI, felony vandalism, and five counts of felony vehicular assault.




The lawman stopped the truck for the speeding violation and identified the driver as Chad A. Garrett.


