





Clarence Edgar Greene, 65, Blue Springs Road, Sweetwater was charged with aggravated 911 calls in non-emergency situations.

The report states, Deputy Rondel M. Branam, LCSO responded to Blue Springs Road Saturday, around 7:13 PM, on a lift assist call. Prior to the deputy's arrival, dispatch advised Mr. Clarence Greene called 911 again and began cursing at the dispatchers and claiming he'd called approximately an hour earlier for help, although it had been only approximately ten minutes.

When the deputy arrived on the scene, Mr. Greene was sitting in a

rocking chair, drinking a beer. Mr. Greene advised he wanted an ambulance to check out his left arm where he had a minor scrape.

When EMS arrived, Mr. Greene refused to be transported to the hospital so the deputy and EMS left the scene.

Greene had a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage coming from his person, red watery eyes, and thick speech slurred to the point law enforcement couldn't understand him at times. Mr. Greene was advised not to call 911 unless he had an emergency.

Approximately two hours later, Mr. Greene called 911 and the dispatcher advised Deputy Branam he couldn't understand Mr. Greene and that when he'd asked if he had an emergency, Mr. Greene said, "Bye," and hung up.

When Deputy Branam arrived at Mr. Greene's residence the second time, Greene was in the same state of impairment and stated he wanted an ambulance for his prior fall injury to his left arm.

EMS arrived on scene again and advised the deputy Mr. Greene did not have a medical emergency and did not need any treatment for his mi-


and said there would be an activation number on the Walmart receipt.


