According to reports, Officer B. Burley, LCPD conducted a traffic stop on a white Mazda Protege Tuesday, on South C Street for driving without headlights. The driver, Mr. Stokes, was noticeably nervous and sweating profusely.



vated assault, possession of drug paraphernalia and simple possession of schedule VI marijuana.

According to reports, Lt. Adam J. Yokley, LCSO responded to Rest Camp Road Sunday, around 6:07 PM, on a possible assault. The complainant stated John Wayne Brown had been to his house three or four times that day and at one point they got into a fight. The last time Mr. Brown came over he had a stick.

The complainant handed Lt. Yokley what appeared to be a handle off some type of tool with black duct tape on the ends and he advised Mr. Brown tried to hit him with the stick. He took the stick away from him and then

Brown got into a fight with another man at the residence.

Another witness stated John Wayne Brown had come to the house and had threatened everyone there with a club. The complainant sustained injuries to his right forearm and stomach.

All witnesses stated Brown was asked repeatedly to leave the residence.

Mr. Brown had a strong odor of alcohol on his person and was taken into custody. While enroute to the Loudon County Jail Lt. Yokley noticed Mr. Brown moving around in the back seat and observed him getting a plastic bag containing a green leafy substance from one of his pockets. The lawman stopped his patrol unit on Broad-

way near the Sonic and removed Brown from the vehicle.

Brown refused to tell the officer where he put the plastic bag so he was searched. The bag was located in the crotch area of Brown's shorts.

Brown was physically put back into the vehicle after refusing to get back in. While enroute to the jail once more, Brown began banging his head on the cage of the patrol vehicle causing three cuts to his forehead that were bleeding.

Once in the jail, Lt. Yokley found 4 packs of rolling papers used to smoke marijuana. The confiscated marijuana weighed approximately three to four grams.

Corporal Michael Wil-

son, LCSO contacted Detective Jason Diles, Kentucky State Police, and Detective Diles faxed copies of active warrants on Mark Clay Gibson for 1st degree sexual abuse.

Detective Diles also faxed down copies of the hit confirmation from NCIC and a wanted person extradition agreement stating Kentucky will pick up from all states except Alaska and Hawaii.
