began receiving tips to the suspect's identity. In Monroe County, investigators located Timothy Lee Moore, 34, of 2094 Green Road, Madisonville. Moore's mother's vehicle was found with blood in it, and Moore told officers he had cut himself on the foot replacing a friend's window! However, he later confessed to investigators that he was involved in the burglaries and thefts. CID also recovered a shirt that was the same shirt Moore was wearing during the transaction at WalMart. At this time Moore has been charged with burglary,

other with charges pending. The other suspect has been identified and warrants are currently being sought for his arrest, but the Sheriff declined to release the name of the suspect at this time.



Jessika Darlene Klingensmith, 22, West Ninth Avenue, Lenoir City was charged with domestic aggravated assault and assault.

According to reports, Thursday, at approximately 2:34 AM, Officer E. Lawson, LCPD responded to a residence on West Ninth Avenue in reference to a domestic in which Jessika Klingensmith was on the property without permission. The victim was in the street in front of the residence and stated his wife Jessika was inside the residence armed with a butcher knife and advised his 2 year old son was inside as well.

As the officer approached the front of the house, Mrs. Klingensmith came out unarmed. Both parties advised Lenoir City

Police had been at the residence on a domestic disturbance earlier, around 8:15 PM and at that time, Mrs. Klingensmith was picked up by her step-mother and transported to her father's house on Waller Street where she was to stay for the night. Officers instructed her not to return to the residence on West Ninth Avenue.

Klingensmith Mrs. told Officer Lawson she had walked to her West Ninth Avenue home from Waller Street to get some tampons, but when she arrived, her key wouldn't work so she climbed through a window on the back of the house. Klingensmith said she realized a female was in the house with her husband and she became enraged.

The victim and his female guest were in

bedroom when they heard a crash in the kitchen. He went to investigate and encountered his wife. The female guest was trying to leave the residence, but Mrs. Klingensmith began throwing punches at her.

The victim attempted to restrain his wife to allow his guest to escape and the nonresidential female was able to leave the residence and called 911.

The victim advised his wife struck him in the face and arms, then retrieved a large butcher knife from the kitchen and told him she was going to "kill him and his female guest and cut his F&\$@ing D*\$# off." She then began stabbing the bed.

The victim fled from the residence and met Officer Lawson at the roadway. When the of-

Officer Lawson then called the female guest and she returned to the scene as requested. Written statements were taken from both victims and Jessika Klingensmith was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail.




