
Two men were killed and a third injured early Tuesday morning as they fled in a pick-up truck from a Officer Jonathan Yates, LPD.







According • to ports, deputies with Loudon County Sheriff's Office received a call Thursday, of a break-in in progress which had just occurred on Foster Road. The complainant advised E-911 two males, possibly Hispanic or of mixed raced, had left the residence driving a' white newer model Lincoln four door car.

Lt. Paul Curtis, LCSO-ND located the vehicle behind a residence on Loudon Ridge Road. Investigator Marty Stanley, LCSO-ND arrived shortly after Lt. Curtis and with the assistance of K9 Deacon detained the suspects at the vehicle

The two suspects were identified, as James Edward McClain

II and Samuel Eugene McClain. Both men were moved away from the car to allow Lt. Curtis to deploy K9 Deacon for a drug sniff of the air around the vehicle.

As James McClain was walked to the front of Lt. Curtis' vehicle Investigator Stanley noticed a small plastic bag on the ground where Mr. James McClain had just walked. The bag contained 23 smaller bags which each contained a small white rock like substance which field tested positive as crack cocaine. The bags were packaged individually for resale and weighed a combined total of 6.4 grams.





The deputy repeatedly told him to stop, but Bounds continued through the woods and back down into the parking lot. From the parking lot he continued to flee down to the edge of the water, at which point he jumped in and swam away from shore.

Bounds was continually given commands to come to the shore and to stop fleeing, but he swam along the shore line towards the back campsite and when he came within a few feet of the shore he still refused to come out of the water. Bounds was then Tasered with Deputy Hutchen's X26 Taser. The probes struck Mr. Bounds in the back, but he still refused to come to shore and was Tasered again, then pulled ashore where he refused to get on the ground and place his hands behind his back.

Deputies Hutchens and Fritts were able to get Bounds on the ground, place his hands behind his back and place him under arrest.

A check of his name and date of birth revealed Bounds did not possess a valid drivers license and he was a registered sex offender.

The young man who was in the vehicle was only 17 years old and was intending to leave with Mr. Bounds. The young man's parents had been searching for him and were unaware of his intentions to leave with Mr. Bounds.

ing on the ground prior to McClain walking across the area where the bag of crack cocaine was found.

K9 Deacon conducted a sniff of the vehicle and Lt. Curtis indicated K9 Deacon alerted to the presence of an odor of illegal narcotics coming from the vehicle.

A search produced a small set of digital scales with a white residue in the glove compartment. Investigator Stanley made the arrest.

Investigator Shane Ezell, LCSO-ND, was also on the scene.

On June 1, 2012, both McClain's were charged with aggravated burglary.

According to those affidavits, which were filed by Sgt. Detective Charles Cosner, LCSO-

CID; on May 31, 2012, a Lenoir City man called Loudon County Emergency Communications Center and reported two males kicked in the door of his residence on Foster Road. The victim confronted the men as they were fleeing the residence and was able to provide a detailed description of the men, the vehicle they had left in and their direction of travel.

While responding to the location, Lt. Paul Curtis, LCSO-ND located a witness who directed him to a residence where she saw the suspect vehicle pull into. The vehicle and the two men were locat-
