When the time came, Mrs. Sheila Risher began to herd us in, two at a time. Flags and Bible in the front, followed by the smallest kids first and everyone else fell in by age group. We marched in "high stepping" like British soldiers in a parade. We walked up the middle isle and then peeled off with precise timing to the right and left, filling the front pews first and working our way towards the back while singing "Onward Christian Soldier". The most fortunate boys got to sit next to the girls but never actually talked to them.

After everyone was inside we said the pledge of allegiance to both flags and then to the Bible; "I pledge allegiance to the Bible, God's Holy Word. And will make it a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path, and will hide its words in my heart, that I may not sin against God."

After singing some fun songs we split into groups by age for a Bible lesson and then to a different room where each class participated in making some cool crafts, my most memorable being a wooden birdhouse held together with Elmer's glue and painted the color of my choice. Back in those days we worked on the same craft a little each night and then got to take it home on the last night. (Which was good incentive to keep coming back)

The most exciting time about Bible school back then, and prob-

ably now, was getting free time to go outside, hang with your buddies, eat some chocolate chip cookies and have a glass of Kool Aide! That's what I'm talkin bout!

I didn't realize it then but God's Word was being carefully sown into my heart by Christians that had no idea which of those seeds would "take" or which Bible story would be etched into my mind for the rest of my life. Now here I am, thirty years later and I can picture it as if it were yesterday. Can you picture your Bible school as well?

This past week our church conducted Bible school as they do each year. Preacher Mark is always a dynamic pastor but during Bible school he is off the chain. The Lord has taught him how to interact with those children and explain the love of Jesus in remarkable ways. 279 children registered throughout the week and numerous children gave their heart to the

Lord and received an eternal reservation in heaven. I know our pastor and how serious he takes a profession of faith with young folks, For Sale:



as he should. If he announces that a child got saved then I am confident he has gauged understanding, their their request and their ability to know what it means to ask Jesus into their heart. If they are not of understanding he will pray with them and explain to them about returning at such time that the Holy Spirit calls upon them. This is solely so that no child is deceived by a verbal commitment that does not have eternal meaning. Praise God for pastors who care about souls more than numbers of professions.

I only share all of that to say the following; over six people received Jesus Christ during Bible school at our church alone! God is amazing and he is still in the saving business!

Angie and I were able to teach two groups of teenagers how to make the survival bracelets that God has used to help us support missionaries around the globe and to help finance some of our trips. Who knows, God may encourage some of those young adults to do the same. How exciting is that? We were stoked just to be there and acted like children ourselves.




