


Malaquias Leo Alvarado, 20, Ferry Street, Loudon was charged with theft over \$1000 and aggravated burglary.





TWRA boating officers are coming off their participation in the fourth annual Operation Dry Water weekend. Operation Dry Water is a national weekend of BUI education and enforcement directed toward reducing alcohol and drugrelated accidents and fatalities. Operation Dry Water is held during a weekend prior to BUI arrests, up from 51 the July 4th holiday to give BUI enforcement high visibility.

A total of 135 TWRA

officers participated in the 2012 Operation Dry Water, logging more than 1,700 hours. Officers checked close to 2,400 vessels, wrote 180 citations, another 148 warning and made 19 boating under the influence arrests (BUIs).

One boat operator on Chickamauga Lake was arrested for his second BUI offense in three years.

There were no reported fatalities over the weekend and four injury accidents and three property damage accidents. Of the reported boating accidents, two were alcohol related.

TWRA officers were assisted by police departments and sheriff's departments, conducting saturation patrols and checkpoints across the state.

Through the Operation Dry Water weekend, there have been six fatal boat accidents resulting in eight fatalities. There have been 45 injury accidents and 40 other accidents that have resulted in property damage. TWRA officers have made 87 at the same time last year and two above the numbers following Operation Dry Water in 2010.

"There will be increased traffic on Tennessee's interstates and state routes during the July 4th holiday period," said TDOT Commissioner John Schroer. "Suspending lane closures over this busy few days is one way to ensure that

Motorists will still encounter some long term lane closures on construction projects. While lane closure activity will be stopped, workers may be on site in construction zones and reduced speed limits in work zones will still be in effect. Drivers convicted of speeding through work zones where workers are present face a fine of \$250 to \$500, plus court fees and possible increased insurance premiums.

"If you and your family are traveling during this holiday period, please buckle up and observe the rules of the road so you'll arrive safely at your destination," said Highway Governor's Safety Office Director Kendell Poole. "During this coming week drivers will notice an increased law enforcement preson Tennessee's roadways in an effort to ensure that everyone has a safe and happy 4th of July holiday."

According to AAA projections, more than 42 million Americans will travel 50 miles or more away from home this holiday weekend. That figure is up 4.9% over 2011 and up 42%

over 2009, which had the least amount of holiday travelers over the last decade. AAA estimates 753,824 Tennesseans will hit the roadways, while another 36,121 are expected to fly to their destinations. Auto travel will make up 84% of all holiday travelers across the U.S. this year.

Travelers are reminded to dial 511 from any land-line or cellular phone to access valuable information about travel conditions anytime, or log on to . TDOT is also on Twitter. For statewide traffic tweets follow TN511 or for regional trafficinformationfollow Nashville511, Chattanooga511, Memphis511 and Knoxville511. Smart phone users can use the new TDOT SmartWay Mobile website at http:// m.tdot.tn.gov/Smart-Way/ to access TDOT's Smart Way cameras, messages displayed on overhead Dynamic Message Signs.

Motorists are reminded to use all motorist information tools responsibly. Drivers should refrain from texting, tweeting or using a mobile phone while operating a vehicle. TDOT advises drivers to "Know before you go!" by checking traffic conditions before leaving for their destination.
