Earl Duane Dixon, Highway 307, Sweetwater was charged with initiating manufacture of methamphetamine, possession of

a firearm during commission of a dangerous felony and possession of drug paraphernalia.

According to affidavits filed by Sgt. Jason

Butler, LCPD; on August 5, 2012, at approximately 6:25 PM, Sgt. Butler responded to 128 Rogers Circle for a possible meth lab. Upon arrival, the complainant approached the sgt. and stated her young child found a needle in their dog house and when she looked in the dog house she observed what she knew to be a meth lab. She stated she threw the meth lab onto the neighbor's property, located at 126 Rogers Circle, whom she believed had placed the meth lab in

her dog house. Sgt. Butler went to 126 Rogers Circle, knocked on the door and was greeted by a man who lives at the residence. The man led Sgt. Butler cord attached, two neeto the rear of the residence where he found one funnel, one can of Earl Dixon and his wife Coleman Fuel, zip lock Kerrie Dixon, who is a school bus driver for Sweetwater Schools. Sgt. Butler told all three items are used to manuindividuals to walk outside.

Upon gaining consent to search the residence, the sgt. reported he found two light bulbs with the bottoms removed, one needle, one loaded .44 caliber Rugar pistol, aluminum foil, LCPD was also on the ammonium nitrate, lithium batteries, one coffee

filter and two glass pipes inside the room where Mr. and Mrs. Dixon were located.

Sgt. Butler asked Kerrie Dixon to pull her bra away from her body for the purpose of ensuring she wasn't concealing weapons. When she did so, a small baggy weighing approximately .5 grams of a white powder substance, believed to be methamphetamine fell to the ground, as well as one straw.

Outside of the residence, Sgt. Butler found one bottle of muratic acid, one bottle of bi layer liquid, one bottle containing ammonium nitrate, one bottle with tubing coming from the top, one burner with a dles, one coffee filter, baggies with the bottoms removed and lithium batteries. All of the facture and use methamphetamine.

Sgt. Butler reported he believed the loaded firearm was there for protection during and after the process of manufacturing methamphetamine.

FAKE POLITICAL SURVEY

The IC3 has been notified of a scam involving telephone calls conducting a multiplechoice "political survey." Following the survey, the recipients are told they won a free cruise to the Bahamas. After providing a website address for legitimacy, the caller requests the "winner's" email address for notification purposes and credit card information to cover port fees. The website has very information, limited but does contain a few photos, testimonials, and "Caribbean Line" banner, in an attempt to convince visitors it is

legitimate.

The IC3 has received several complaints regarding a phonebook website. Complainants reported that anyone could post other individuals' information. Some reported being verbally bullied, had uncensored comments, or false accusations posted about them. Personal information that could be listed on the website included:

# FREE CREDIT SERVICE WEBSITE

The IC3 has received over 2,000 complaints regarding a particular website that is claiming to offer "free" credit services such as credit scores and credit monitoring. Customers reported being charged a monthly service fee. However, the terms of the agreement advised that the "free" report only lasts for a limited time. At the end of the free term, the website used the customer's supplied financial information to charge a monthly membership service ranging from \$19.95 to \$29.95.

The terms and agree-

ment from the website states the following:

"For Subscription Services which include a free-trial period, if you do not cancel your free trial within the free trial period, you will be charged at the monthly rate in effect at that time for the Subscription Services for which you enrolled. Your debit or credit card (including, if applicable, as automatically updated by your card provider following expiration or change in account number) will continue to be charged each month at the applicable monthly rate unless and until you cancel the Subscription Services."

The website, according to the Better Business Bureau (BBB), has been given an Frating by the BBB for the following reasons: 1037 complaints filed against the business. 8 complaints filed against the business that were not resolved. 17 serious complaints filed against business. Advertising issue(s) found by the BBB.


