

NASHVILLE - A Monroe County woman is charged with TennCare fraud in Loudon County, for selling prescription drugs paid for by TennCare.

The Office of Inspector General (OIG) announced the arrest of Amanda Lynn Brown, 36, of Vonore, after a joint investigation with the Loudon County Sheriff's Office. She is charged with TennCare fraud and sale and delivery of a Schedule II controlled substance. Charges say Brown filled a prescription for the painkiller Oxycodone, which was paid for (see Brown pg. 5)







by TennCare, then sold a portion of the pills.

"We have zero tolerance for people who use TennCare to buy drugs and then sell them to people in our communities," Inspector General Deborah Y. Faulkner said. "These drugs can be dangerous in the

wrong hands."

The TennCare fraud charge against Brown could result in a two year sentence, if convicted. District Attorney Gen-

eral Lawrence Russell Johnson is prosecuting.

Brown was arrested and charged with sale and delivery of schedule II oxycodone and possession of drug paraphernalia earlier this year when she and a Vonore man were stopped for speeding and officials found several prescription pill bottles and paraphernalia in the vehicle and in the pair's possession. None of the bottles contained the number of pills they were supposed to. (See the Tuesday, March 13, 2012, edition of The daily Edition for the story.)

The OIG, which is separate from TennCare, began full operation in February 2005 and has investigated cases leading to over \$3.5 million paid in restitution and recoupment to TennCare, with a total estimated cost avoidance of over \$173 million for the TennCare program, according to latest figures. To date, over 1,700 people have been charged with TennCare fraud.





him driving his Freightliner all over the road on 1-75 and when THP located him found he reportedly was under the influence of several different prescription medications.

Jonathan Allen Weaver, 36, Kingsland, Georgia was charged with DUI 1st offense.

According to records, at approximately 2:48 PM, Trooper Eric Miller, THP received a BOLO for reckless and unsafe operation of a white Freightliner commercial vehicle traveling on Interstate 75 North at the 65 mile marker. Knoxville dispatch received approximately 6 phone calls from different complainants stating the truck was all over the roadway, driving on the shoulder and they

were afraid to pass it.

Trooper Miller made contact with the semi at the 76 mile marker and witnessed it cross the center line then drift over the fog line onto the right shoulder of the road. The truck traveled on the right shoulder for approximately 10 feet before the trooper initiated his emergency equipment.

The driver slowed to around 50 mph and went about 1.5 miles before coming to a stop. The driver, identified as Jonathan A. Weaver, was very uncoordinated, disoriented and unsteady on his feet.

During field sobriety tasks Mr. Weaver was very unsteady and uncoordinated on his feet to the point where he almost fell numerous times and couldn't perform as instructed. He was placed under arrest. The implied consent advisement was read and he consented to a legal blood draw.

Mr. Weaver gave verbal consent to search his vehicle and during the search numerous prescription medications were found. The prescriptions were for methocarbamol mg, tramadol 50' mg a schedule IV, and diclofenac 75 mg. The medications stated on the bottles "may cause drowsiness, use care when operating machines, alcohol may intensify this effect." Mr. Weaver was transported to the Fort Loudoun ER for the blood draw and then to the Loudon County Jail.
