According to affidavits; on August 4, 2012, Deputy Chris Bowen, was dispatched LCSO to domestic disturbance Highway 70 East

where a woman said she and her live-in boyfriend, Stephan D. Martin, were in a verbal argument that became physical and just the day before, they were out with friends in Knox County and were asked to leave an establishment due to Mr. Martin's level of intoxication. At the time, there was also an altercation with the other couple they were with and she went and

stayed with her friend for the rest of the night. woman said she was walking home the next day when Martin approached her and convinced her to get in the car, telling her he would take her to get her vehicle and let her leave. When she got in the car, however, Martin became violent and struck her head against the dash by force.

The victim advised he then transported her to his parents residence on Highway 70 East and when they arrived he continued to strike her and would not allow her to leave.

Martin allegedly attempted to place the woman in the trunk of a vehicle and made verbal threats to kill her and cut her fingers off, placing her in fear of bodily injury or death.

Records indicate at

some point the victim was able to text a third party and tell them of the situation and that person then contacted the Loudon County Communications Center and deputies were dispatched.

On arrival of law enforcement, Mr. Martin fled the area into the woods to avoid prosecution. The owner of the property, identified as one of Martin's relatives, arrived on the scene and locked up the residence.

Corporal Pete McGinley transported the victim to a place of safety and while enroute to the location, Martin sent her a text, which said he'd watched all parties leave (the residence) and she (had) really messed up this time and she would
