





Burglary

Jonathan Sartin, LCPD; on or about September 15, 2012, Candace IIlana Moore and Jason Tyler Kriger went to a Bon Street residence

in Lenoir City. While there, the pair did enter the residence and upon entering the residence took a table, microwave and other items.

The items were taken

without the owner's permission or knowledge.

Candace Illana Moore, 27 and Jason Tyler Kriger, 33, both homeless, were charged with aggravated burglary.

Detective Jonathan Sartin, LCPD made the arrests and filed the charges.

#### Reckless

Burley observed the vehicle and clocked it on radar at 102 mph in a 65 mph zone and immediately initiated his lights and siren. The véhicle failed to stop for the officer and continued for approximately 1 and 1/2 miles at speeds in excess of 90 mph. During that time the driver crossed over the lane divider multiple times before stopping on the shoulder. The driver was identified as Jennifer Nichole King.

The officer reported Ms. King had an odor of an alcoholic beverage on her person and slurred speech. The officer then observed a 1/2 empty bottle of Vodka in the backseat LCPD, served the warfloorboard. Ms. King rant at the Loudon performed poorly on sobriety tasks and stated she had drank two 33 oz. beers two hours earlier. Ms. King was then informed she was under arrest for DUI and she began to struggle and would not provide the officer her arm to be handcuffed

and had to be forcibly handcuffed and placed in custody.

After being placed under arrest the officer conducted a search, which revealed a pink tablet believed to be Cialopram 20mg, a legend drug, in a hydrocodone bottle in Ms. King's purse.

Jennifer Nichole King, 31, of Foster Lane SE, Cleveland, was charged with DUI 2nd offense, reckless driving, possession of a legend drug without a prescription and resisting stop, halt, frisk and search.



rants, during the search agents discovered 16.9 grams of a off white rock substance, that field tested positive

for crack cocaine, was found in a down stairs closet. A glass marijuana pipe was found in a table drawer located next to the front door. A

set of digital scales with a white powder residue and a red plate with marijuana residue was found in the kitchen above the microwave.
