

Nevius and Gillis then exited the store without paying for the merchandise and loaded items into a black BMW owned by Nevius.

The pair then fled the scene on the vehicle. During the subsequent investigation Detective

Kevin Condee identified Nevius and Gillis on the Home Depot security video.

James Nevius was picked up at Knoxville Jail and transported to the Loudon Jail by Deputy Kevin Kirkland LCSO.
