It will be easy for me to become a fisherman in order to witness to those who love to fish; it will be easy for me to become an elk hunter so I can be qualified to share my faith with elk hunters; what I must remember is that I may have to become a homeless person (for a time) to gain the opportunity to share with the homeless or I may have to become a college student at a catholic college to be able to share with other college students.

I, we as Christians, sometimes will called to leave our area of comfort in order to reach the lost. We may have to sacrifice some of our time, some of our talents and even some of our treasures in order to make the

gospel of Jesus known to the nations. Are you willing?

Today's message was as much for me as it is for you. I pray that I am always faithful in seeking and sharing with the lost. I pray that I am willing to do whatever it takes to proclaim the name of Jesus to those God places in my path.
