or similar to the desired alt. Many fraudsters go extreme lengths to have ar own website appear read of a legitimate comany on popular search enmes. Their website may a mirrored version of a sopular website, but with a slightly different URL.

Purchases made on these sites could result in one or more of the following consequences: never receivung the item, having your credit card details stolen, or downloading malware/ computer virus to your computer. Before clicking on a result in a search ongine, inspect the URL of the destination website. Look for any misspellings or extra characters such as a period or comma as these

al tips you can use to avoid becoming a victim of cyber fraud:

Do not respond to unsolicited (spam) e-mail.

Do not click on links contained within an unsolicited e-mail.

Be cautious of e-mail claiming to contain pictures in attached files; the files may contain viruses. Only attachments from

known senders. Scan the attachments for viruses if possible.

Avoid filling out forms contained in e-mail messages that ask for personal information.

Always compare the link in the e-mail to the link you are actually directed to and determine if they match and will lead you to a legitimate site.

Log on directly to the official website for the business identified in the e-mail instead of "linking" to it from an unsolicited e-mail. If the e-mail appears to be from your bank, credit card

issuer, or other company you deal with frequently, your statements or official correspondence from the business will provide the proper contact informa-

Contact the actual business that supposedly sent the e-mail to verify that the e-mail is genuine.

If you are requested to act quickly or there is an emergency that requires your attention, it may be a scam. Fraudsters create a sense of urgency to get you to act quickly.

Remember if it looks too good to be true, it probably is.
