to one day enter the gates of heaven based upon a meaningless dunking, or sprinkling, that occurred in their childhood and was not based upon a true profession of faith and acceptance of Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord? I fear that the number is more than we can imagine. I am convinced that it is somewhat common in Lenoir City, in Loudon, in Friendsville as well as here in Helena, Montana.

can recall being a young boy attending Friendship Baptist Church in Lenoir City one Sunday morning about thirty something years ago. My friend had went to the front of the church the week before and placed his faith in Jesus. We were friends. We went to one another's house after church almost every week and sat together every Sunday. He had just got saved so I decided that I needed to do the same. That's what friends do, right?

The pastor led me in a prayer and I agreed that I wanted to invite Jesus into my heart but I can recall that my thoughts that morning were not on eternal matters but that I was doing what my friend had just done, what every church going kid does, and now we were going to get baptized together! (And we did) have no reason to doubt the sincerity of my friend's conversion and it would be several more years before the reality of my soul's true condition was revealed

to me in the most powerful way. What I can tell you, is that the baptism I experienced with my friend was not what is required to spend eternity with Jesus. It was merely a bath.

It was not until that Monday night revival on November 17, 1987, that the Holy Spirit of God revealed to me that that if I did not place my faith in Jesus and confess Him as Lord and Savior that I would not be entering the pearly gates of heaven but would spend eternity in the fiery pits of hell. Nobody wants to hear about hell anymore but it is a real location that will eternally house all of those who reject Jesus and the fires within will never be quenched. I could not lay my head on the pillow that night until I had confessed that I was lost without Christ and invited Jesus into my heart. I told Jesus that I believed He

sin, gave His life on the cross to pay for my sins and that I believed He rose on the third day and is now at the right hand of God the Father and could hear my prayer. I then asked Jesus to save me and after that conversation I have never doubted where I will spend eternity again!

I was soon baptized I was in fact lost and for a second time, but this time as a true believer. It is important to note that I am not confident of my eternal salvation because of baptism, but because I placed my faith in Jesus Christ as my Savior, my Redeemer, my Lord. To be baptized is to publically associate ourselves with the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is scriptural and appropriate but not a pre-requisite for heaven. (See the story of the thief crucified with Jesus in Luke 23:42-43)

I have let Jesus down many times since that lived on earth without night and I have much

to be ashamed of, but I have never again had to doubt where I will spend eternity. So, if was baptized as a youth and thought I was saved but was not, and I have encountered others who have been baptized in earlier years but had never truly repented of their sin and placed their faith in Christ, how many more folks are there like me, my friend Connie or Katrina, the lady I met today at Wal-Mart?

This is not a scare tactic to have every Christian doubt their salvation but an opportunity for a reality check that has eternal consequences. Is the location of your eternity not worth this conversation knowing the extreme differences between the two options available to us? I can only hope so! Did you experience a ritual or do you have a relationship with Jesus Christ?

Do you want to know for sure where you stand

with Christ? First, let's validate today's topic through scripture;

Mathew 7:21-23 NKJV (21) Not everyone who says to Me, "Lord, Lord," shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven. (22) Many will say to Me in that day, "Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?" (23) And I will declare to them, "I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!"

Secondly, let's see how we can know if we are truly Christians;
