was in the rear of the vehicle. Deputy Burley did smell the odor of alcohol as well as marijuana coming from the vehicle. Burchfield did admit to having smoked marijuana as well as drinking alcohol. A 3/4 empty liquor container was also located in the vehicle. Burchfield did poorly on all standardized field sobriety tasks. After being placed under arrest Burchfield did initially agree to Tennessee Implied Consent, however; while en route to Ft. Loudon E.R. for a blood draw Burch-

Deputy Burley observed that the juvenile was out passed curfew, as well as the Deputy console. One glass marijuana could smell alcohol and marijuana coming from the vehicle.


Burchfield who was the operator of the vehicle intentionally permitted the juvenile to be out passed curfew, as well as provided the juvenile with alcohol and marijuana.

Deputy Burley did arrest Burchfield for Driving under the influence and after placing Burchfield under arrest K9 Deputy C. Hutchens did utilize his K9 partner Dante who provided a positive alert for the presence of narcotics in the vehicle. A subsequent search of the vehicle yielded 20.1 grams of marijuana from the center console. There were also 5 grams of marijuana located in Hopkins left boot.

Burchfield did also admit that he and his girlfriend Jenkins did meet Hopkins to deliver \$20 worth of marijuana to Hopkins which Burchfield did
