Officer B. Brown, LCPD was dispatched to I75 on a reckless driver call. Detective Sartin was in the area

and was able to observe a white van, swerving over the center line almost striking another vehicle. The complainant, an off duty Detec-

tive from Roane County observed the vehicle strike a guard rail and grind against it for approximately 200 yards. Upon contact with

the vehicle the driver was identified Melvin Lee Swiney and he unsteady on his feet, had slurred speech and was unaware he was in Lenoir City. Swiney admitted to taking oxydone and xanax earlier and performed poorly on sobriety tasks.

Inside a fake mountain dew can was two plastic bags with a white powder substance believed to be methamphetamine. Also found in the car were many different types of pills were laying loose. There were 14 oxycodone 15mg, 4 Diazepam, 1.5 pills identified as Alprazolam and 2.5 pills identified as xanax. In a separate cylinder was 1.8 grams of marijuana. A BAC was taken at the hospital.


