
Better lock up all your stuff

A Hispanic man jailed in recent days on a charge of making false 911 calls where he allegedly claimed to be an investigator has been taken into custody again after making more calls where he portrayed himself as a law enforcement officer. He reportedly was found to have been in possession of several illegal pieces of identification when taken into custody on the additional charges.

According to the warrants filed by Agent Brendan Deboer, 9th DTF; Ernest Zerbanates Rodri-

guez aka Ernest Nombrano placed numerous 911 calls to the Loudon County 911 center. During these calls, Rodriguez identified himself as a Knoxville Investigator that couldn't stay to talk with respond- (see **Illegal ctd. pg. 7**)







recklessly engage in conduct, which placed others in danger. Lewis did so by operating a white Chevy Silverado

in an aggressive manner, tailgating and chasing another driver.

Lt. Mike Tinnell and Sgt. Lynette Ladd, LCPD witnessed a

portion of the offense. Upon investigating it was discovered that Lewis has a valid handgun carry permit.

Lewis had a strong

odor of an alcoholic beverage on his person and stated he'd drank 3 or 4 beers approximately 2 hours prior. Mr. Lewis had a loaded weapon within his reach in the vehicle.

Mr. Lewis stated when the road rage incident occurred he took the weapon from under the seat and had it beside him. The weapon was a Smith & Wesson .45, which was loaded with a full magazine

and had two other fully loaded magazines with it.

Lewis did possess the loaded weapon while under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs.

Richard Allen Lewis, 54, of Meadow Drive, Lenoir City was charged with reckless endangerment and possession of handgun while under the influence.

ing units attempting to locate him because he had to respond to a murder in Knoxville.

Rodriguez was arrested for placing false 911 calls and after his arrest was read his rights and agreed to speak with investigators.

Rodriguez stated he did

in fact call 911 and that he did identify himself as a Knoxville investigator because he thought they would take him more seriously. When Rodriguez was arrested he was found to be in possession of a fugitive recovery badge, a pair of handcuffs and two handcuff keys. Agents be-

lieve that Rodriguez has an obsession with being a law enforcement officer and has gone to some extremes to portray himself as such.

In another warrant, when agents from the 9th DTF and LCPD served a felony warrant at a local hotel for a Hispanic male they believed at that time

to be Ernest Nombrano, the subject was located and found to be in possession of two counterfeit state identification cards. One of the ID cards was from Tennessee and the other from California.

After further investigation it was found that subject's name was not Ernest Nombrano, which was displayed on the ID's with his picture. Follow-

ing Miranda warnings it was found the subject had purchased the ID's on the "black market."

Ernest Zerbanates Rodriguez, aka Ernest Zerbanates/Cesar Rosales, 31, homeless was charged with criminal impersonation of a law enforcement officer and criminal simulation.

Cpl. Angi Martin, LCSO made the arrest.
