





as a detective. I don't cite my investigative resume in a bragging fashion, but only to establish that I have a pretty good idea of what is destroying our families. Outside of my professional experience, I have also dealt with the devastating effects of pre-

scription medication abuse in and around my own family. I believe each person reading today has somehow been affected either directly or indirectly by this problem at some point in their lives. I am convinced that the addiction to pills is the driving force behind the majority of the crimes, broken homes and neglected children in our region and across the country.

I realize that most of the folks who are affected so greatly by this epidemic do not have the resources to go spend a year in a facility designed to "cure" the desire for pills. The question I ask you today has probably been asked at hundreds of kitchen tables and conference tables all over our state..... What can we do to help folks get off these pills?

We can put them all in jail

but pills get smuggled in there as well. We can send them across the state to live with extended family but pills are just as easily obtained in almost every state of our nation. We can shut down the pain clinics but new ones open every day under a new hame. So what is the answer? How will we ever fix this problem?

Let me ask this question to the folks who are struggling with pill addiction; If you really want to shake the addiction, if you really want to get your kids back, if you really want to regain your self-reliance and dignity, have you even considered the possibilities of what Christ is capable of? Has it crossed your mind even one time as you read The Good News articles week after week that maybe.... just maybe... there is

something to this power of Jesus that I speak about so often?

Now, to the family members of those struggling so hard with this problem; have you knelt before an Almighty God and prayed for them daily? Have you encouraged them to seek God and trust in Him for strength? Have you raised them to know Jesus and lived a Godly example in front of them. Can they see the true power of God working in and through your own life? If not, are you ready to start today? Are they not worth it? Is God not worth it?

Folks God hasn't failed us; we as Christians have failed Him. We do not see God because we do not seek God. I see both men and women on the street regularly who tell me that




