According to warrant, filed by Agent Brendan Deboer, 9th DTF; beginning in January 2012 several individuals began to organize their efforts and illegal activities in order to manufacture methamphetamine. McKinley, Brandon Shannah Moore and Johnnie Rhonda Duck-

ett worked together to obtain the ingredients to manufacture and distribute meth in the 9th and 10th districts of Tennessee. Brandon Mckinley burglarized several homes in Loudon and Meig's Counties in order to obtain items that could be sold for cash for use to purchase ingredients and pre-cursors for the

meth manufacture.

Shannah Moore was the main buyer of the Brandon pre-cursor, psuedoephedrine. Mckinley and Moore would obtain this pre-cursor and bring it to the "meth cook" Johnnie Duckett who would then turn the pre-cursor into finished product methamphetamine.

Duckett would also take stolen property in exchange for the finished product meth. Mckinley was also responsible for eliciting the assistance of 15-20 "smurfs", or people used to purchase components for meth manufacture. Mckinley was also responsible for the theft and sale of several firearms that he stole in these burglaries. Mckinley is a convicted felon and conspired

with others to manufacture meth.

Jarod Mckinley, 29, of north A Street, Lenoir City, was charged with conspiracy to manufacture meth. Deputy Elin Wilburn, LCSO made the arrest.

Shannah Faye Moore, 27, of Hoffman Lane, Lenoir City, performed poorly on was charged with conspiracy to manufacture meth. Agent Brendan Deboer, 9th DTF made the arrest.


### Police beat


