Child Neglect

Lt. Upton was dispatched to Browder Hollow Road to investigate a possible child abuse/neglect. Upon arrival the Lt. spoke with Sgt. Jerramie Bowen who reported they were investigating a burgiary call that led them to the residence of Jodi Lea Branum and noticed she was very unstable and was under some type of narcotics.

Upon further investigation

it was learned there were three children in the residence, a 2 month old, a 3 year old and a 1 year old. Upon further investigation it was also learned that inside the residence pills and needles were found beside a crib. The crib also had an alcoholic beverage inside of it and had spilled.

Investigation also showed that marijuana was smoked in the residence and Mrs. Branum did admit smoking marijuana and also more was found in a back bedroom. Pills identified

as Adivan were also found in the residence. Mrs. Branum was not in any condition to take care of herself and clearly not the children. The report also stated Mrs. Branum was in a narcotic overdose state putting the kids safety in danger. Mrs. Branum advised the pills found (adivan) were also taken and she did not have a prescription for them.

Browder Hollow Road, Lenoir City, was charged with possession of schedule VI (marijuana), possession of schedule VI (adivan) and child neglect x3. Lt. Detective Patrick Upton, LCSO CID made the arrest and filed the charges.

Cats should be confined in a pillow case or pet carrier for the handler's and animals' safety. Dogs should be on a leash.

Willis was sitting in the back drivers side seat and stated he was fine but very concerned about his dog that had ran out of the car after the accident.

Mr. Willis had slurred speech, red eyes and smelled of marijuana. The deputy asked for identification and Willis reached for a blue

and black bag that contained his ID. The deputy reported he could hear the sound of glass hitting something and saw Willis trying to conceal something in the floorboard. The deputy asked Willis to stand up and it was found he had a glass jar containing approximately 12.5 grams of marijuana. Inside the

bag the deputy found there were 39 individual small clear bags. Also in the front drivers floorboard there was a marijuana cigarette that was burnt on one end and warm to the touch. While talking to Mr. Willis Deputy Bearden observed a set of digital scales fall out of his pocket. A search of Mr. Willis produced approximately 3 more grams of marijuana in his pocket. Mr. Willis declined medical treatment and performed poorly on sobriety tasks. Mr. Willis also provided a BAC test at the hospital.

The passenger, Adam Carter Duckworth admitted to consuming marijuana at the time of the accident. Mr. Duckworth had the odor of marijuana emitting

from his person and performed poorly on sobriety tasks. There were two marijuana roaches found in the front seat of the vehicle where Mr. Duckworth was occupying. Mr. Duckworth was also in possession of one of the roaches.

Adam Carter Duckworth, 18, of Shaw Ferry Lane, Lenoir City, was charged with public intoxication and simple possession of schedule VI. Deputy John Bearden, LCSO made the arrest.

The other vehicle involved was driven by Randall Lord. Mr. Lord broke the windshield of his vehicle when his head made contact with it. Mr. Lord was seen at the hospital and was found to have lacerations on his head and

chin, a sore elbow and shoulder and a concussion as a result of the crash.














